UNITED NATIONS, Sept 22: European Community foreign ministers pledged on Monday to complete ratifica tion of the Maastricht treaty on European union but Britain was at odds with its partners over the timing, reports Reuter.

The ministers, meeting in special session at the United Nations, stressed the treaty should not be renegotiated and ratification should be speedy but without a firm deadline.

The meeting came a day after France narrowly voted in a referendum to accept the treaty and after a week of turmoti on European currency markets.

British Foreign Secretary Douglas Hurd said the ministers were concerned with widespread public distillusion with the EC summit next month. A British spokesman said it was likely to be held in London on October 16.

Hurd told a news conference that concern arose "from worry and anxiety that our community has drifted to some extent out of touch with the citizens it exists to serve.

#### Germany worried over Britain's intention

An earlier AP report from Bonn says: Worried that the Maastricht treaty cold still unravel despite French voters' narrow approval of the accord, Germany on Monday set its sights on trying to ensure that Britain doesn't stall European union.

In an effort to appease concerns at home. Chancellor Helmut Kohl's spokesman, Dieter Vogel, indicated Germany would seek a "clarification" or "supplement" to the Maastricht treaty to spell out which decisions

would be made on a Europeanwide level and which would be

left to individual countries. In the wake of the French vote, a top aide to Foreign Minister Klaus Kinkel guestioned the commitment of British Prime Minister John Major to European unity.

"Someone should ask John Major how seriously he takes Britain's presidency of the 12nation European Community, Ursula Seiler-Albring, parliamentary state secretary in the Foreign Ministry, said on Hessischer Rundfund radio. The EC presidency, currently held by Britain, rotates every six months.

Seiler-Albring was responding to Major's announcement that he would not summit the Maastricht treaty to Parliament for ratification until the European Community finds a way to bring Denmark - which rejected the accord in a referendum earlier this year -

"It seems to me that Maastricht is like that famous dead parrot," Former Minister Lord Tebbit said on Monday, warning Major that the treaty could tear the party apart.

Major tried to stamp his authority on the flerce debate over Maastricht by calling an extraordinary European Community summit for early next month.

# ASEAN trade bloc to attract more investment than US

SINGAPORE, Sept 22: A proposed free trade zone among a half-dozen South East Asian Nations should make the region even more attractive for investment from the United States, the new US ambassador to Singapore said, reports Reuter.

"A lowering of tariff's on materials, and being able to trade them freely, will enhance the position of ASEAN as a place to invest," John Huntsman told a press conference after presenting his credentials to President Wee Kim

Huntsman, who succeeds Robert Orr, said," capital these days is hard to come by. I think the economies of this region like any other will have to work to make themselves attractive."

The Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN) Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore and Thailand - as a group ranks as the fifth-largest US trading partner.

The group's heads of state agreed in January to create an Asean Free Trade Area (AFTA), cutting tariffs on 15 major groups of products and raw materials to a maximum five per cent within 15 years. The first cuts are due to take effect next January 1.

Huntsman, whose family owns the largest private chemical company in the US (Huntsman Oil) of Salt Lake City, said he would join other US ambassadors to ASEAN on a tour of US cities next March aimed at promoting US exports to ASEAN.

Orr and other US envoys made a similar tour last March. "An important message we need to deliver to the small and medium size business in America is that the world is growing beyond our boundaries. And we need to pay more attention where it's growing, especially areas like South East Asia, " he said.

The itinerary was not yet set but would probably include Seattle and Los Angeles,

Huntsman said. Direct vestment by ASEAN in the US would not be on the agenda, he added.

Huntsman said he expected Singapore's strong economic and security ties with the US to grow further.

The US is Singapore's largest investor, with some nine billion US dollar committed by 800 US companies which employ about 95,000 people, or six per cent of the work force, Huntsman said. Singapore is the eleventh

largest market for US exports. Bilateral trade is now about 22 billion US dollar a year, more than with China, Spain or Italy, Huntsman said.

He also said a 1990 pact with Singapore to allow greater US access to the is land's naval and air facilities has been a "model agreement. Officials would review the pact

Singapore agreed in January to host a key US naval logistics unit relocated from Subic bay in the Philippines.

## Third World advised to rely less on aid

WASHINGTON, Sept 22: A joint ministerial panel of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the World Bank told developing countries here on Monday to rely less on scarce foreign aid and give top priority to mobilising and boosting domestic resources for their own development, reports

Ministers of industrial and developing countries, after day-long talks in the 22-member development committee in their final communique issued a catalogue of advice to the Third World governments on how to increase their countries capacity of attracting private funds.

The panel recognised that the poorest countries, mainly in Africa and Asia, will continue to require substantial concessional assistance for many years, and noted that a number of additional countries, including some of the republics of the former Soviet Union, had joined the list of

potential aid recipients. But the committee chairman, Chile's Finance Minister Alejandro Foxley, questioned about the prospects for aid flows, said "we expect they will not increase significantly."

Therefore, he said, the developing economies should rely more on private transfers.
