



But FIFA Secretary General Josef Blatter warned: "Maradona must now do everything possible to show that he is worth all that we, the football family, have done for him. "He must let his talent ex-

the clubs included a clause on Maradona's behaviour. "Maradona must understand that there are not only sporting rules, but also regulations in civil and private life," said

But only hours later, Maradona took a shot at Ferlaino, a favourite target, accusing him of breaking a promise made in 1989 to allow the player move to French club Olympique Marseille.

He told the private Italia I network: "President Ferlaino promised me the day after the UEFA Cup semifinal that, if we won the trophy, he would let me go to Marseille, who had made a good offer. But we know what that produced."

His subsequent behaviour, including turning up late at training, was the result of Ferlaino not keeping his promise, Maradona said in a telephone interview late Tuesday.

"I am not going back to Napoli because one of us had to go," he said.






