
The BFF have already asked the DSAs and clubs to submit their nominees for the course.

### Too many idle stars in Italian league worries FIFA



ROME, Sept 25: FIFA, football's governing body, plan to tackle the problem of the surplus of foreign

players in the Italian League which has left millionaire stars sitting on the bench, reports

General secretary Josef Blatters said the issue would be addressed at the organisation's December meeting.

"What's happening at the moment is not fair to the countries of origin of these players", he said in a television interview on Thursday.

"And it's not good for them that each week they must sit the sidelines," Blatter added: "We want to open a dialogue to avoid the concentration of too many star players in one club, especially if the rules curtail them."

While not referring to any players in particular, the

problem of a surplus in especially acute in AC Milan, where six foreigners must compete for the three places allowed under Italian League rules.

It has led to the farcical situation where 11-million-dollar signing Jean Pierre Papin of France and Dutch striker Ruud Gullit have been benched as coach Fabio Capello juggles his over abundance of talent. Dutchmen Marco van Bas

### TCCB fines Lamb £5000

LONDON, Sept 25: English county Surrey have been given a suspended fine for ball-tampering, the illegal practice which sparked a major row, involving one of their players, between England and Pakistan

this season, reports Reuter. The Test and County Cricket Board (TCCB) said on Thursday they had fined Surrey a maximum 1,000 pounds sterling (1,700 US dollars), suspended for two years, for repeated breaches of the rules and regulations.

Surrey were warned in both 1990 and 1991 for breaching the law which bans players from altering the condition of the ball.

The TCCB's action came just 24 hours after they had fined Allan Lamb a record 5,000 pounds (8,500 US dollars) for breaking his England contract by alleging in an unauthorised newspaper article that two Pakistan bowlers had tampered with the ball.

Lamb accused Wagar Younis, who plays for Surrey and competed in the two games for which the county were previously warned, and Lanchashire's Wasim Akram of repeatedly tampering with the ball to produce "murderous late swing that won them the Test series.

Pakistan officials and the two bowlers repeatedly and vehemently denied any charges of ball-tampering.

The International Cricket Council, who investigated the claims, were severely criticised by the English media for refusing to reveal why a ball was changed during a one-day international between England and Pakistan.


