Maradona's debut for Sevilla today

SEVILLE, Spain, Sept 27: Can Diego Maradona still play? Some

clues may appear Monday when the Argentine soccer idol considered the world's No. 1 player until he was suspended 18 months ago for drug use debuts for FC Sevilla in an exhibition game with the German club Bayern Munich,

reports AP. The Spanish First-Division side bought the Argentine's transfer from Napoli last week for dlrs 7.5 million, ending a three-month-long drama over where he would play after he refused to return to Napolt.

An expected capacity crowd of 70,000 at Sanchez Pizjuan stadium and a worldwide television audience will get the first glimpse of the new Maradona in the 9 pm match (2000 GMT). but it's likely to be several months before any old magic might appear.

No matter how Maradona plays, Sevilla and Spanish soccer seem to have already benefited from his presence. The club has sold 3,000 season tickets in just a week - surpassing the previous total sales record of 33,000 and prompting talk of the figure reaching 40,000.

in addition, team officials estimate television rights for Monday's game will bring in dirs 1.5 million.

Maradona, who in June completed a 15-month suspension for cocaine use, underwent a drug test and physical Thursday before his first official practice with Sevilla a mediocre team that has not won a league title since 1946.

The squad is led by former Argentine national team coach Carlos Bilardo, a close friend of Maradona's and the main reason he chose Sevilla.

Although Maradona has told reporters he is in "perfect shape" and ready to play 45 minutes against the German club, his trainer admitted the 31-year-old star was overweight and would need three months of play and conditioning to be at full strength.




