High furnace oil price pushes newsprint output cost up

Khulna Newsprint Mills and North Bengal Paper Mills are paying an additional amount of Taka 19 crore annually for mandatory purchase of furnace of from Bangladesh Petroleum Corporation.

Officials concerned told UNB that in absence of alternative energy, like gas, these two industrial units have to buy furnace oil at whatever price charged by Bangladesh Pet-

roleum Corporation (BPC). BPC is selling furnace oil at Taka 7,693 per ton to these two units as against the export price of Taka 3,900 and local price of Taka 2,811 per ton. BPC is vested with the exclusive authority of importing, processing and selling petrolcum products.

Sources alleged that BPC is consistently making use of their monopolistic status concerning the supply of this input by charging higher price having no practical relevance to the price level of such a

product in the international market. The soaring price of furnace

oil propel increase in the production cost of newsprint. Newsprint is now selling at Taka 19,786 per ton which was Taka 18,000 ton last year.

Officials said Khulna Newsprint Mills need 50,000 tons of furnace oil and North Bengal Paper Mills 18,000 tons annually

The private sector industrial units located in North Bengal and other relatively less-developed areas get a subsidy of Taka 2811 per ton of furnace oil while these two units are denied of any kind of

BPC exports furnace oil at prices ranging between Taka and 3,900 per ton which is substantially lower than Taka 7,693 per ton paid by these two industrial units.

The steady rise of the price of furnace oil is shown in the following figures - price per

litre was Taka 0.36 in 1973 Taka 1.18 in 1975, Taka 1.97 in 1979, Taka 3.92 in 1981 Taka 4.70 in 1987, Taka 5.10 in 1990 and Taka 7.11 in

Sources said the price has increased 20 times within a period of 19 years from 1973 to 1992, whereas BPC earned a record proft of Taka 350 crore during 1991-92 alone

The abundance of profit of BPC may be a potential source of revenue for the government but the unusually high price of furnace oil poses a formidable threat to the newsprint mill and the newspaper industry.

Khulna Newsprint Mills produces 48,000 tons annually at its peak eapacity and North Bengal Paper Mills 13,000 tons as against its capacity of 15,000 tons.

Officials stressed on logical price slab of furnace oil for commercial viability of these two units.
