Paradise thrills theatregoers

By Fayza Haq With vivacity, charm and wit, the Paradise Island Express, the visiting US theatre group, delighted the audience at a local hotel on Wednesday. The four performers played their parts with gusto in the 'American musical theatre' play which contained entertaining well-known songs and dramatic interplays. The large number of expatriates in the audience lapped up the songs while the locals also seemed to be glad to listen to Western music from days gone by. The Paradise Island Express began their three-session performance at the Hotel Sheraton on Tuesday. The group is currently on a tour of the sub-continent and they have already visited Pakistan, India, Nepal and Sri Lanka. The artistic director, blonde-haired Deirdre K. Lavrakas, speaking about her experience said 'We've met each challenge in the tour that began in Kathmandu, went on to Pakistan, Sri Lanka and India --to cities like Madras, Bangalore and Calcutta -- and we are proceeding to Bangkok. We have cut out the spectacle, lightening and acrobatics because otherwise the drama of that would overwhelm the actual performance.' Talking of the workshops that she and Michael W. Howell had conducted, Lavrakas said, 'We had the language barrier but we had the same goal. One of the facts that I was impressed with was that this was the first time I was able to work with artists for two days at a go. I have not covered such a large group before.' Howell added, 'The rhythms of the movement are different but the needs and desires of the people are the same here as in USA and all over. We were most impressed by the openness of the people. We became like a family. The body language had a lot of common signals.' Susan M. Bender, an award-winning soprano, who has performed with symphonies and musical companies in USA and Europe, said at a press conference at USIS 'all of us are free lancers. I focus on classical Western music and am also a teacher. I have to wait for the phone to ring to get a contract, but there has not been a time that I wasn't a part of a musical performance. I held performances for the public television and have a bachelor's degree in musical education.' Thirty-year old Pedro Porro, an award-winning actor told about himself, 'I began acting on TV at the age of 10 in a role as the son of Judas and I have been acting and singing since then. I graduated from high school and have a bachelor's degree in architecture. I am a part-time architect, and I love the music with my architectural work. I plan, however, to go into music on a full-time basis.' Debra Tidwell described herself as a 'singer, who acts. I have been performing since I was quite young. I began professionally at college when they discovered that I had an overwhelming voice. Tidwell is an award-winning Washington-based actress and a vocalist. Thirty-seven year old Michael W. Howell, who was full of joie de vivre and had an affable manner, said that he began his singing career in high school and majored in Theatre Arts when he graduated in '77. 'I am employed by the radio and TV and am registered with a couple of agencies to help my bank balance.' The company has begun work on this particular performance since December as Lavrakas explained. 'I wanted to show the richness of the twenties and thirties. I am afraid I could not put in everyone's favourite number. Out of the 80 actors and singers who auditioned for this group the four chosen were apparently the best.' 'What we try to do in the show is to give a really good sampling of the American musical theatre tradition through its shows and composers,' Lavrakas explained. 'The songs are musically and lyrically rich and varied.'
