Housewife strangulated to death

Oct 4: A housewife was strangulated to death allegedly by her husband for dowry in Kendua thana of the district last week, reports UNB.

The victim Latifa Begum (20), wife of Zillu Mia of Laskarpur village in the thana, was seven months pregnant, according to family sources.

Family sources added that Zillu Mia demanded a huge amount of money as dowry from her father and forced her by torture to bring the money.

On the fateful day, when, Latifa refused, Zillu beat her mercilessly and at one stage he strangulated her to death.

RI for possessing explosives

Punishment to killers of AL leaders demanded

Oct 4: The district unit of Awami League Monday last demanded immediate arrest and punishment to the killers of the party leaders Ali Hossain and Chand Mia, reports UNB. In a joint statement, Presi-

dent Motahar Hossain Talukder and Secretary Abdul Latif Mirza of the unit condemned the killing and expressed grave concern over the deteriorating law and order situation.

Tarash thana Awami League vice president Ali Hossain was killed by the miscreants on September 13 at Gultabazar and Sramik League leader Chand Mia was assassinated on September 26 on Bahirgola Road in the town.

The outlawed Sarbahara Party, styled as Purbabangla Communist party, however, claimed the responsibilities of both the killings.

Meanwhile, Sadar police arrested one local Jamaat-e-Islami Party worker in connection with the killing of Sramik League leader Chand Mia.

Planned farming needed to attain food autarky

Oct 4: Planned cultivation of root crops, potatoes and vegetables is the prime need to attain self sufficiency in food, reports UNB. Director of Bangladesh

Pest attack alarming, aerial spraying demanded

DINAJPUR, Oct 4: Amain paddy on 20,000 acres of land under pest attack in different thanas of the district. The situation is alarming, it is reported.

The worst affected thanas are: Nawabganj, Hakimpur anid Ghoraghat. It is reported by the farmers that insecticides which they spray on their lands were ineffective in killing the pests. They said that they face it very difficult to purchase the pesticides due to exorbitant rates in the open markets.

The farmers are suffering much due to the shortage of sprayers. They expressed that if pest attack is not stopped immediately, the prospect of Aman cultivation in these thanas will bleak.

According to the farmers, the leaves of the paddy plants are turning yellowish due to pest menace. If proper mea sures are not taken to combat the attack, the production will fall considerably.

On the other hand, due to price hike of insecticides

farmers are unable to spray their fields to combat the pest attack. Meanwhile, adulterated

insecticides have flooded the local markets. If positive steps are mot taken immediately to curb tihe

menace, the situation may go out of control within two or three weeks. The farmers demanded aerial spray throughout the thanas. A UNB report from Lalmonirhat says: The rice and


