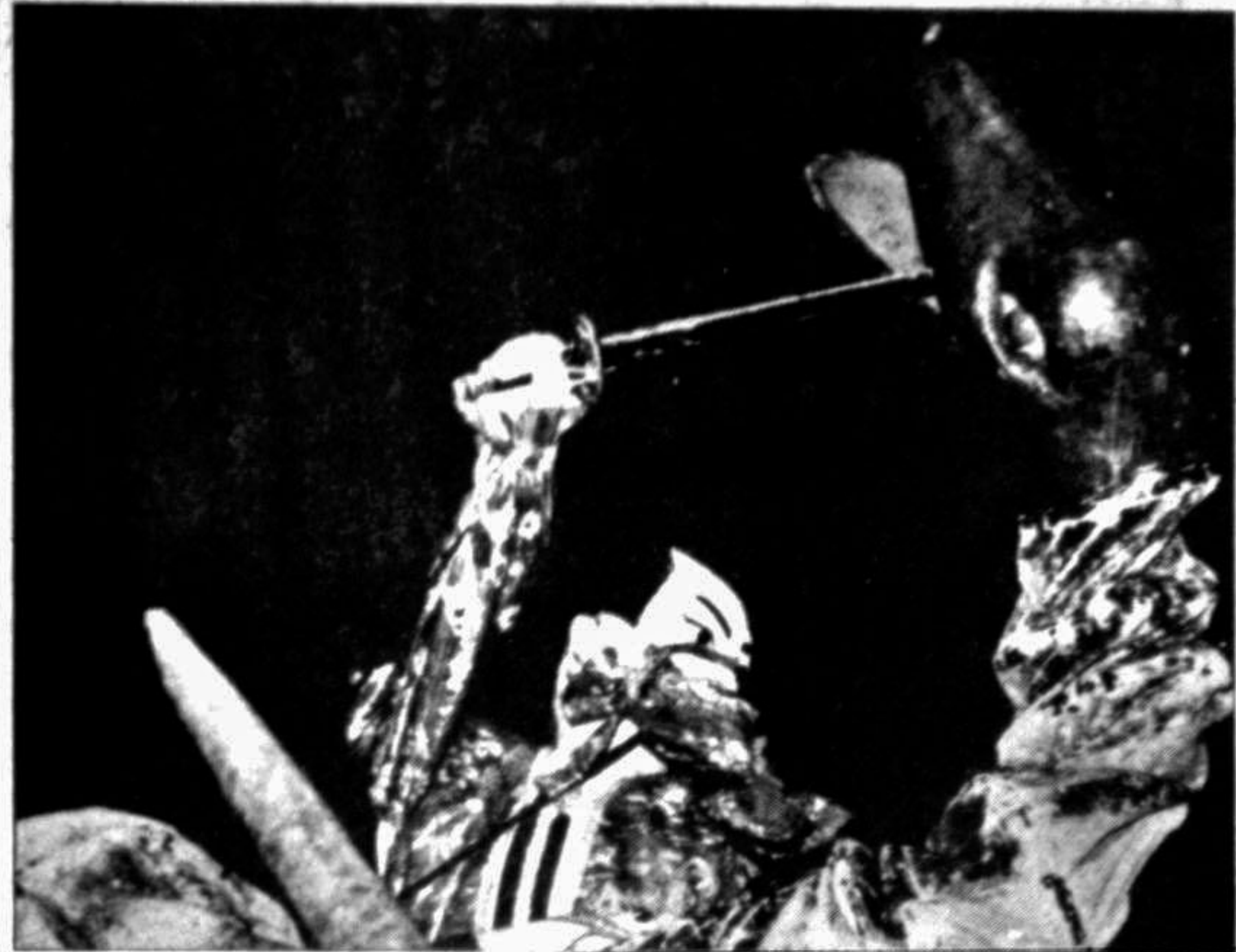

**National thrust to protect children's rights suggested**

Social Welfare and Women Affairs Minister Tariqul Islam yesterday called upon the affluent section of the society to spend a portion of their wealth for the welfare of the country's less fortunate children.

The minister said that the gigantic task to protect the rights and privileges of the children could not possibly be fulfilled by the government alone.

"There should be an united and integrated national thrust to protect the interests of the children as laid down in the United Nations convention on the rights of children", he added.

The minister was addressing as chief guest a discussion held on the occasion of International Children's Day and in connection with the concluding ceremony of the week-long programme on the rights of the children organised by the Ministry of Social Welfare at Shishu Academy auditorium.

The week was inaugurated on September 29 by the Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia at a colourful ceremony at Osmani Memorial Hall where she declared sanctioning of Taka 400 crore for the overall development of the children in the country.

Presided over by Social Welfare Secretary Prof K M Fariduddin the discussion was also participated, among others, by State Minister for Social Welfare and Women Affairs Begum Sarwari Rahman and Chairman of the Shishu Academy Dr Kazi Anowara Mansur.

Tariqul Islam said that most of the children of the country were born in pitiful conditions and were deprived of their basic needs like food, shelter and medicine.

Tariqul Islam said the government had taken a number of measures to protect the rights of the children and let their latent talents flourish so that they could play their due role when the national responsibility would be entrusted on them in future.

He stressed the need for creating mass awareness among the children so that the children could know all about their rights and privileges and act accordingly.

Begum Sarwari Rahman said that the present government had taken a number of long-term and short-term programmes to ensure education, shelter and medicare facilities to the children. The government have also taken various schemes to develop the mental faculties of the less fortunate children both in urban and rural area of the country.

The discussion was followed by a tasteful cultural functions rendered by children from various educational institutions and children organisations.
