The new unit with an annual capacity of 3,30,000 metric tons will be set up on the site of Fenchugani Natural Gas Fertilizer Factory in Sylhet to reduce the high cost of production incurred by the old

Concerned officials told the meeting that using the present infrastructure, utility and offsite facilities was essential for the viability of the project.
