Suranjit demands govt statement on 'push back'

Suranjit Sengupta MP, leader of the Ganatantri Party at a public meeting Tuesday demanded clear-cut government statement on the 'push back' issue.

He criticized the Indian government for its communal attitude and inhuman move and also held that he said the kowtowing foreign policy of the government responsible for such a consequence.

Suranjit, however, suggested that a bilateral or multi-lateral talks on the issue might solve the problem.

The meeting held at the Bangabandhu avenue Tuesday afternoon was addressed among others by Mohammad Afzal, General Secretary, Mahmudur Rahman Babu and Shaiful Maola, Azizul Islam Khan, Acting President of the party presided.

Referring to the ordinance for curbing terrorist activities Suranjit said the government would first have to prove its honesty by taking stern action against the terrorists of its own student front. Only then the opposition political parties might take part in the discussion for finding out the ways to contain terrorism, he added.

He, however, demanded withdrawal of the ordinance saying that it was against the provisions of human rights in the Constitution.

Maniruzzaman's death anniversary observed

The Awami League-backed Chhatra League (M-I) Tuesday held a rally on the Dhaka University campus to observe the second death anniversary of Shaheed Maniruzzaman.

Maniruzzaman Monir was killed on this day in 1990 during the anti autocratic movement.

The BCL (M-I) leaders in the rally held at the Aparajeo Bangla of the university said that the government failed to establish a democratic atmosphere in the country even after a year of coming to power.

The rally was addressed by the BCL leaders Iqbalur Rahim, K H M Lizu, Manzurul Islam Asru, Akhter Hossain, Pankaj Nath with the BCL President Mainuddin Hasan Chowdhury in the chair.

The leaders condemned the 'anti-terrorism ordinance' of the government and said that this was promulgated only to suppress oppositions.

The BCL President Mahnuddin said that the government did not materialise the students' 10-point demands and added that the elected democratic government had now been acting as the neo-autocrat.

Meanwhile, the Ganatantrik Chhatra Oikya (GCO) held a rally in front of the DUCSU building at the DU to observe the death anniversary of Shaheed Maniruzzaman and urged to make today's rally of Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee a success.

The rally was addressed by the GCO leaders Ruhul Quddus Babu and Rajib Ahsan Munir.
