Sircar seeks teachers' help to upgrade standard of edn

Education Minister Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar Friday sought the cooperation of all quarters particularly the teachers' community to raise the standard of education in the country, reports BSS.

He said the present government was pursuing the people oriented politics and so it had attached utmost importance for the development of the country's education.

The Minister was addressing as chief guest the conference of the Bangladesh Government Colleges Teachers' Association at Scouts Bhaban.

Presided over by M Mozaffar Hossain, President of the Association, the conference was addressed by Labour and Manpower Minister Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan and Dr Yeaz Uddin Ahmed, Chairman of Bangladesh Public Service Commission, as special guests, Yunus Mia, Director General of Secondary Higher Education

Directorate, Principal Mahmud Mukarram Hossain, Prof M Shariful Islam and Prof Hasanul Bari, General Secretary of the association.

The Education Minister said the government had taken a number of steps including Compulsory Primary Education (CPE) nationalisation of schools and colleges, passage of the Open University Bill and Private University Bill to make education system perfect and people-oriented.

Referring to the association's demands for new appointment of teachers, promotion of the teachers and making the terrorism-free educational arena, the Minister said their problems would be resolved gradually.

He, however, said the problems of all professionals could not be resolved overnight in this problem-ridden country but these could be solved through discussions and negotiations.

The Minister thanked the teachers for helping to hold the SSC, HSC and BA examinations of the past two years properly and publish its results in due time.

Sircar expressed dissatisfaction over the deterioration of 'education and urged the teachers to evolve methods in improving the standards of education.

CHITTAGONG, Oct 16: Minister for Environment, Forest, Fisheries and Livestock Abdullah Al-Noman has said the good educational atmosphere is the precondition of the qualitative standard of educational institutions, reports BSS.

Two stabbed in city

Muggers stabbed two persons and snatched away Taka two thousand and four hundred at Rayer Bazar and Kawran Bazar in the city yesterday (Friday). A degree student of Ideal College was waylaid by four muggers in front of Rayer Bazar Mukti Cinema Hall at about 5 pm when he was going to his friends house.

The victim was identified as Mohammed Nazir Ahmed aged about 21. The muggers stabbed in his head and hands and snatched away Taka one thousand and six hundred in cash, his wrist watch and a chain.

Later he was sent to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH).

In another incident Mohammed Shafique, a businessman was stabbed by three muggers near Kawran Bazar mosque at about 7 pm while crossing the road. Muggers stabbed in his throat and snatched Taka eight hundred. He was sent to the DMCH.

Navy seizes fishing boat in Khulna

KHULNA, Oct 16: Bangladesh navy ship 'Patuakhali' during its routine patrol in the coastal areas today seized a fishing boat and arrested three pirates on board alongwith stolen fishing net worth about Taka forty thousand, reports BSS.

The fishing boat F B Rajhangsho was impounded from Gangpara in the river Balashar.

The BN personnel earlier recovered smuggled crockeries and electrical appliances worth about Taka two lakh from the river Pussur.

The arrested persons were handed over to the police while the recovered goods were deposited with the customs authorities.
