Meaningful Miniatures

The second Miniature Art Exhibition, held at the Alliance Francaise, was full of colours. varied styles and numerous themes. For a change, one found paintings within the means of the average art patron in Dhaka.

Qayyum Chowdhury's water colour composition, 4 inchx6 inch, was a delightful creation of a tree, with its hollow and numerous branches. This had been done with quick strokes and had luminous yellow to offset the dark tree, highlighted by reds and pinks. It created an atmosphere of peace and tranquillity. Qayyum Chowdhury is at present the head of the department of graphic design at the Institute of Fine Arts in Dhaka.

Samarjit Roy Chowdhury's "Untitled", a water colour creation, 3"x4", had a woman dreaming, with a flower in hand. Nature was brought in cleverly with swirls of blues, reds and greens. Except for the figure of the woman, it could be taken for a semi abstract creation. Samarjit Roy is an associate professor of the department of graphic design at the' Institute of Fine Arts in the city.

Nasreen Begum's still life in water colour was 4 inchx5 inch, and revealed leaves arranged in a vase in an unusual manner. It took you some time to discover what the subject was because of the masses of brown , beige and green that had been used on the piece. It was a bit different from her purely decorative works that the public had seen before. Nasreen is a lecturer at the Department of Oriental Art at

the Institute of Fine Arts. Kanak Chanpa's "Muro Dance", an oil on wood, 3 inch by 4 inch, depicted tribal girls in blue, green and dark hues. The background and foreground too were dark, touched with red and pale blue. Kanak Chanpa is well known in the city for her delineation of tribal life. She creates a world which is something quite different from that of the other artists. Kanak is a free lance artist and has exhibited in six miniature shows in USA and in Bangladesh,

and has won an award in Florida Khalid Mahmood Mithu's "Nature and Butterfly", an oil on paper work, 4"x5", was a semi -abstract creation, with reds, blues, green and purples. It was a gorgeous medley of colours and textures, and was both idyllic and picturesque. One almost lost oneself dreaming along with the muted romantic hues. Mithu has participated in a dozen miniature exhibitions

in USA and Canada. "Nature" by Jamal Ahmed, a water colour,

4"x6" ,in shades of blue , depicted men in a boat. The manner in which the artist had put layers upon layers of colour brought in the countryside of Bangladesh with an impact. The men in the boat were tiny, seen against the vast expanse of the river, but their inclusion in the composition had a tremendous impact. Jamal has won two prizes in USA.

"Composition" in oil on paper, 4"x6", by Ifthikharuddin Ahmed, included rickshaws and rickshawpullers. The delineation was done in such a manner that you could not comprehend the subject at a first glance. You took the rickshaws for monsters with the dark background of black, green and blue. Iftikharuddin has participated in miniature art shows in USA and

The untitled mixed media, 5"x5", by Mahmudul Hague was an abstraction which included squares and spheres in purple, blue and green. The position of the squares was interesting indeed. Mahmudul is the Head of the Department of Print- making, and has participated in miniature art exhibitions in Brazil and

The green, blue and black composition in oil on canvas, 5"x5", by Mohammad Eunus was a Jascinating creation in abstraction. It consisted of circles, triangles and squares Eunus, who has won two awards from USA for miniature art work, has taken part in five miniature art exhibitions in USA. He is, at present, a lecturer at the Fine Arts Institute.

Bulbon Osman's mixed media, 4"x5", was an interesting abstract creation, with splashes of red and blue and intersecting lines of red, green, and blue. Bulbon is the Associate Professor of sociology of art at the Institute of Fine Arts.

"In Expectation", a mixed media, 3"x4" by Abdus Shakoor Shah appeared a strange bejewelled web of pinks, reds, blues and green with endless crisscrossing yellow lines. This abstraction was scintillating with colours, as were most of the other work in the exhibition.

Showkatuzzaman's "Garden", an oil on glass, Sonil Ronjan Howlader's "Story" in mixed media, and Shumana Haque's "Woman", an oil painting were all meaningful, appealing and absorbing.

The exhibition had brought together an interesting variety of talents and offered the buyer something to decorate their homes at a reasonable price.



By-polls prove govt neutrality: Huda

Information Minister Barrister Nazmul Huda said here yesterday that the two recently-concluded by-elections had proved that the government had not influenced the administration and that the elections were held free and

"The BNP government believes in free, fair and neutral election and not in rigging ... and the two by-elections have demonstrated the government's sincerity in holding neutral and impartial election, free from any influence," Huda said in an interview with BSS at his office.

The Minister thanked the leader of the Opposition in Parliament Shetkh Hastna for admitting the fact that election were held free and fair.

Huda said "the holding of free and fair elections has also manifested BNP government's commitment to democracy and sincerity to give it an institutional shape under the leadership of Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia."
