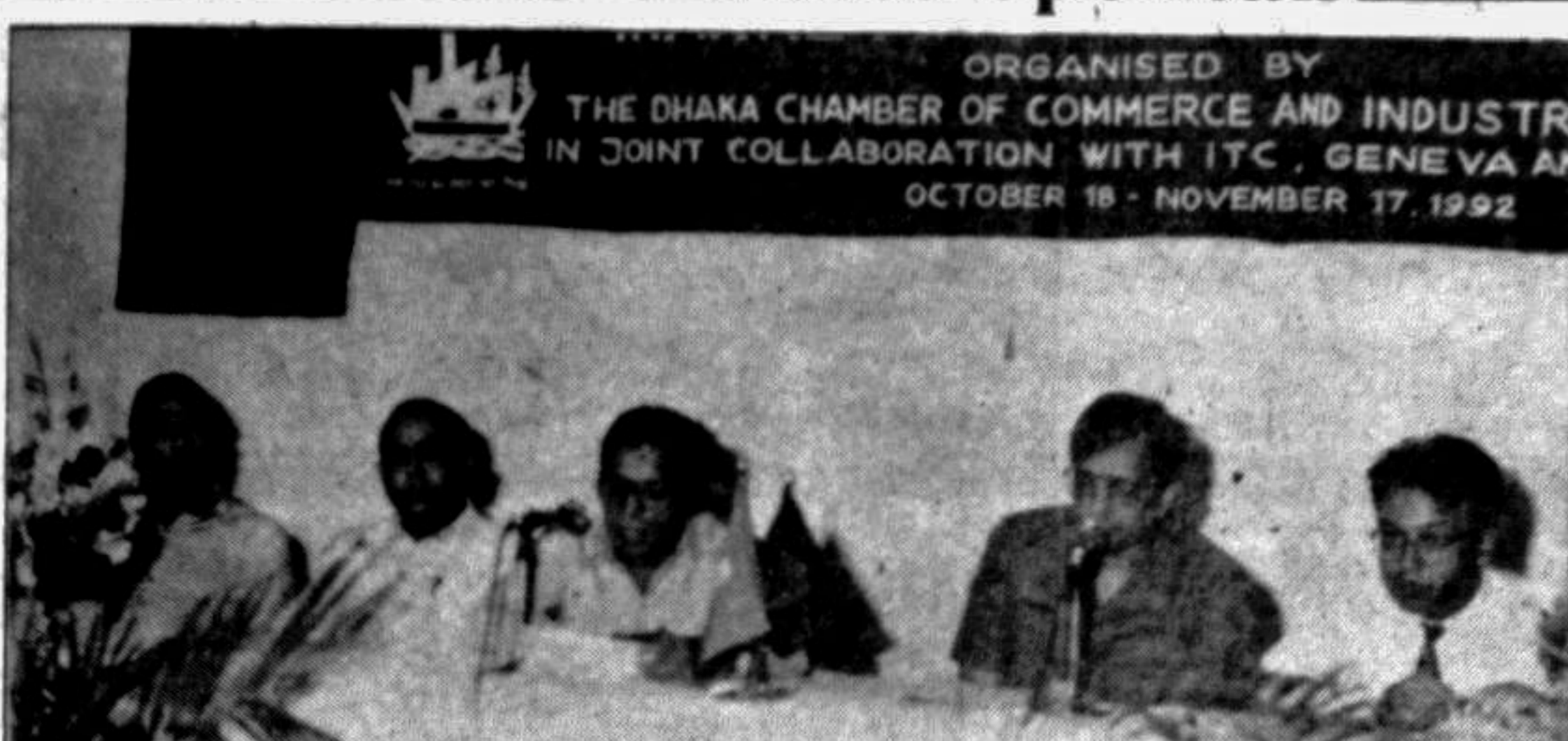

Hundreds of Rohingyas await repatriation

Increasing number of Rohingyas refugees are volunteering to be repatriated to their homeland in Myanmar and a large number of them had been taken to Rangkhali transit at Teknaf during the past few days.

An official source told BSS in Cox's Bazar Sunday that several hundred Rohingyas are awaiting repatriation at the Rangkhali transit camp and that their number was increasing day by day.

The source said that Rohingyas refugees are being encouraged to volunteer for repatriation when they came to know that those who had so far been repatriated to Myanmar were living in peace with full security of their life and property.

A total of 112 Rohingyas refugees had been sent back to Arakan in two batches on September 22 and October 12 and they are happy there, said the source.

Some Bangladesh officials also visited recently some areas of Maungdaw and Buthidong in Arakan and they found the repatriated refugees happy and secured, the sources added.

Seven get life terms for murder

CHITTAGONG, Oct 18: The Third Additional Sessions Judge, Chittagong, Muhammad Mofizul Islam today awarded life imprisonment to seven persons on charge of murder, reports BSS.

The prosecution story is that accused Nur Muhammad, Taher Meah, Forkan Ahmed, Jehangir, Abdun Nur, Kesto Dey and Mofiz Meah of west Sultampur, Rauzzan Thana, kidnapped Polin Chakraborty and killed him later. Polin's body was concealed in a pond.

The Judge examined ten witnesses in this connection and found the accused persons guilty. Kafiluddin appeared on behalf of the state while advocates Syed Zahir Hossain, Prodip Dev and S Mollah defended the accused persons.

Financial help to be given to victims of line explosion in Ibrahimpur

Energy and Mineral Resources Minister Khanjokar Mosharraf Hossain yesterday assured the House that financial assistance will be given to the victims of 132 kv power line explosion in Ibrahimpur, Belabo on September 22 leading to the death of 11 people and injuring 25 others, reports UNB.

Replying to a call notice the minister said an inquiry committee set up by PDB is finding out the cause of the explosion and its effect. Financial assistance to the victims will be given after the finding is available, he added.

He said PDB and the government as well had expressed profound grief at the loss of life. But he said, initial findings showed PDB personnel were not wholly responsible for the accident.

Earlier, Sardar Shakhwat Hossain Bakul (BNP) in his notice narrated the incident in which three persons died on the spot and 8 others in hospital.
