



Stefan Beckenbauer, son of former World Cup coach Franz Beckenbauer beloed kenbauer, helped

The draw stretched Bayern's unbeaten run to nine games but cut their lead at the top to one point after second placed Eintracht Frankfurt won 2-1 at Nuremberg. Bayer Leverkusen, who beat

Kaiserslautern 2-0 at home, are level on points with the Frankfurt side in third place. Stefan Beckenbauer is nowhere near the class of his

legendary father, who captained the former West Germany to the 1974 World Cup title and also coached the Germans to their triumph at the 1990 World Cup. He also has no ambitions to

switch to the libero role that his father made famous. But the defender, who

learned the game at Bayern where he played in the youth team, could be happy with his solid marking job on the Bavarians' dangerous striker Bruno Labbadia. Saarbruecken opened ag-
