The key-note speaker was Dr Mostafa Kamal, national programme manager of AIDS.

Prof B Chowdhury said AIDS is transmitted through sexual contact with an HIV (Human Immurodeficiency Virus) infected persons, transfusion of contaminated blood, sharing contaminated syringe, needles, infected pregnant mother to her child.

He said no vaccine and curative treatment has yet been discovered against the AIDS virus and the fate of the victim is cent percent mortality. Though AIDS is preventable through creating public awareness and taking some measures like using condoms, having sex only with legal partner and use of disposable syringes.

### Forge unity to resist evil forces: Jamaat

The leaders of Jamaat-e-Islami Tuesday called upon the people of all sections to forge unity to resist the evil forces involved in unholy activities against the sovereignty of the country, reports BSS.

They were addressing a public meeting at the Purana Paltan crossing here to protest against the killing of Jamaat worker Maulana Abdul Matin.
