CHITTAGONG, Oct 21: Acting Amir of Jamaat-e-Islami Bangladesh Abbas Ali Khan today reiterated his demand for unconditional release of Prof Golam Azam saying he is a citizen of Bangladesh by birth and he has been detained illegally, reports BSS.

Addressing as chief guest at workers' conference of Chittagong city, North and South districts Jamaat-e-Islami, at the J M Sen hall this afternoon, he said, our movement will continue till the release of Jamaat leader Prof Golam Azam. Three get life term for possessing illegal arms

Three people were sentenced yesterday to life term in jail for possessing illegal arms and ammunition, reports UNB.
They are M Jinnah (25) of village Partilla in Satoria thana of Manikganj district, Tajul Islam alias Babul (26) of village Bhaora in Ashuganj thana of Brahmanbaria and Bhajohari Rajbangshi (34) of Bhagalpur Lane of Lalbagh thana in the city.
Special tribunal judge Zafar Ahmed Mina pronounced the judgement after examining 9 witnesses during hearing of the arms case.
According to the prosecution, complainant Si Dhiren of Dhanmondi PS arrested Jinnah wanted in a dacoity case. Following the statement of Jinnah, police later arrested Tajul and Bhajohari.
On their confession on May 12 last year, police recovered a revolver with 18 bullets from a drawer of the showcase at Bhajohari's residence. A case was registered with Dhanmondi police in this connection.
Police chargesheeted the three accused under section 19 (A) and 19 (F) of the Arms Act.
The court also confiscated the revolver and bullets to the state.

'China stands for model of developing country'

China has set up a model for the developing countries by rapid progress in the economic field and industrialisation through foreign investment in joint ventures following its decade-long open-door policy, reports BSS.
This was stated by D P Barua, Chief Editor and Managing Director of Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha (BSS), in his speech on "Changes in China" as a guest speaker at the weekly meeting of Rotary Club (Buriganga) at Sonargaon Hotel.
Summing up impression of his 12-day visit to China in the first half of September this year, Barua said China has embarked upon fast economic liberalisation programme allowing foreign investment in 30 major sectors for a period of 50 years since 1980.
In his speech, Barua mentioned basic transformation in rural areas and remarkable improvement in the lot of farmers as a result of distribution of land after dissolution of the "commune system".

Stands fifth in first class

Mohammad Sabirul Islam Hawlader stood first class fifth in honours final examination in Arabic Literature of Dhaka University, says a press release.
Sabirul is the fourth son of Mohammad Nezumul Haq Hawlader of Purbachar Umed village under the district of Bhola. He obtained 623 marks in the honours final examination. He wants to be a teacher of university in future after the completion of PhD.
