'Govt has failed to fulfil pre-poll pledges'

Acting Secretary General of Jatiya Party ABM Shajahan yesterday (Friday) blasted the BNP government for its 'utter failure' to fulfil people's aspiration and tackle the issues threatening national sovereignty and independence, reports UNB.

"This government has totally failed to fulfil people's aspiration and the pre-election pledges it made", Shajahan said as chief guest at an extended meeting of Jatiya Sramik Party, the labour front of the Jatiya Party, at the National Book Centre auditorium.

He said the government has failed to create any employment opportunities for millions of educated unemployed youths of the country "but is retrenching workers from different sectors as instructed by the World Bank."

President over by JSP senior vice-president Anwara Begum, the meeting was also addressed, among others, by former labour minister Sirajul Hossain Khan and JSP general secretary MA Gafur.

Portraying a grim picture of the country's rural economy, the JP leader said about 80 per cent farmers are now in pitiable condition as they are not getting fair price for their produces.
