Terming the ordinance as a "black law worse than the Special Powers Act", the opposition MPs said that it violated the Constitution, went against the fundamental rights of the people and the United Nations Human Rights Charter.

Sit-in near Kashmir border: 100 held

Hold plebiscite in Kashmir, Pak NA asks Delhi

MUZAFFARABAD, Pakistan, Oct 26: Pakistan's National Assembly asked India today to hold plebiscite in Kashmir and urged the UN to send a factfinding mission to the disputed Himalayan region, reports Reuter.

The resolution was adopted by Pakistan's Lower House to mark the 45th anniversary on October 27 of the entry of India's army into Kashmir to fight Pakistani troops moving across the east of the region. It came a day after a student was killed and several people were injured in a clash between marchers in Pakistanruled Azad (free) Kashmir trying to storm the UN-monitored ceasefire line with India, and Pakistani paramilitary forces.

Earlier, Pakistani police fired tear gas and arrested more than 100 people today to break up a sit-in by Kashmiri activities near the heavily defended ceasefire line with India, witnesses said. They said police moved in at dawn to arrest Mohammad Hayat Khan, former President of Pakistan-ruled Azad (free) Kashmir, and legislative assembly member Sardar Khalid Ibrahim to stop them approaching the border. The witnesses said more

than 400 people, who had spent the night at a barbedwire barricade blocking the road about eight km (five miles) from the border, were dispersed by police and paramilitary forces firing tear See Page 12 Col 6.
