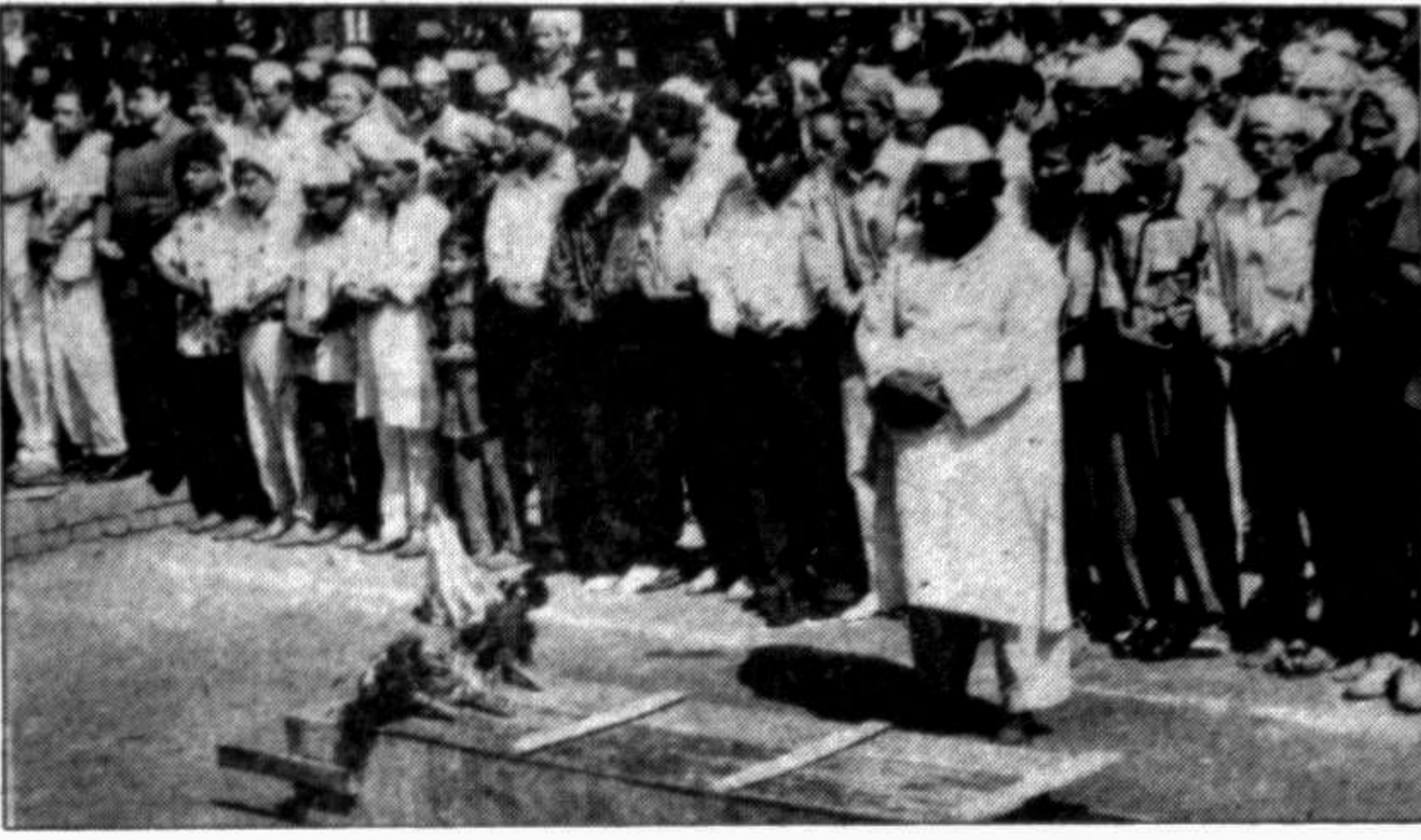
Khairul's death condoled

Education Minister Jamiruddin Sircar said at Savar yesterday that the present government aims at introducing a people-oriented education system for imparting education to the people of all stratas of life, reports BSS.

He was speaking as the chief guest at the installation ceremony of the students' union of Savar College here.

Presided over by Principal of the college A G M Saad Jaglul, the function was addressed by Amanullah Aman, MP, local MP Niamatullah Sabu, Barrister Ziaur Rahman Khan MP, President of Dhaka district Awami League Shamsuddoha Khan Majlish, General-Secretary Benzir Ahmed, Vice-President of college students union Helaluddin Chowdhury and General-Secretary Mizanur Rahman Mizan.

The Education Minister said, the government has already launched Compulsory Primary Education and mass education programmes to bring all of the people under the umbrella of education. Those who cannot afford formal higher education in the universities will be given same technical and general education through Open University.

he added. The Minister said that the session jam in the colleges will be removed after establishment of the National University.

Sircar said the BNP government aims at making the students worthy citizens through imparting their quality education. He also called upon the students to maintain peaceful atmosphere in the campus through resisting violence and anarchism.

Call to resist 'evil force'

UNDP is not involved in any way with such a volunteer programme. Neither is it in contact with the above mentioned organization. Therefore, UNDP cannot take responsibility for any actions of the 'Jatto Proshikheto Juba Sanhad'. Any person who has any claim against the said organization should take the matter up with the appropriate legal authorities, says a press release.

BNP selling out democracy to autocrats: Azad

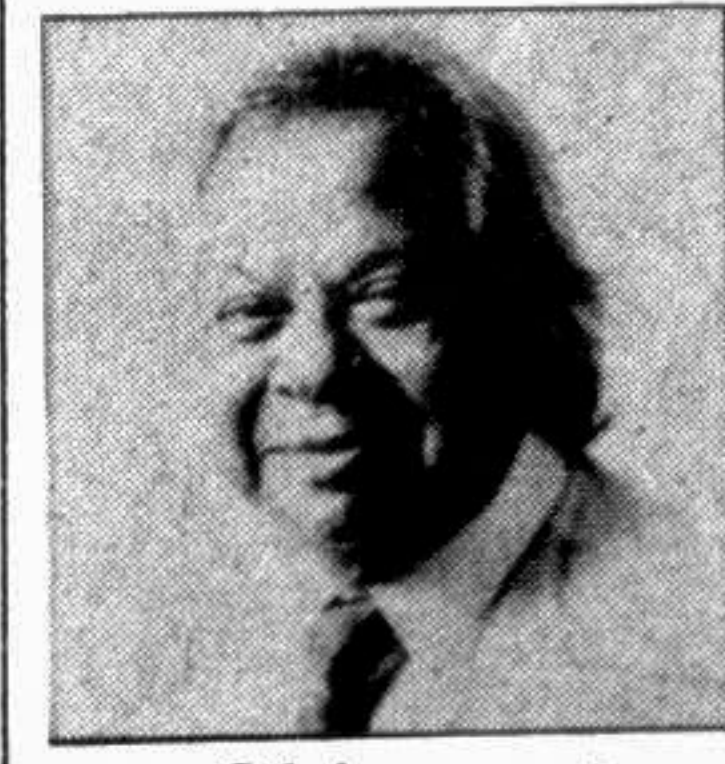


Coffey due today
