Activities of the "use of rural maternal centre in population programme" was reviewed at the meeting.

Experts recommend formation of Islamic centre

Experts, planners and policy makers from Muslim countries yesterday recommended for establishing an Islamic Centre for Human Resources Development at a suitable place under the umbrella of Organisation of Islamic Conference (OIC), reports UNB.

The suggestion came at the concluding session of a seminar on "Human Resources Development in Islamic Countries: Challenges of the 21st Century."

The three-day seminar was participated by more than 130 delegates from Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Malaysia, Libya, Egypt, Qatar and the host, Bangladesh.

The seminar urged the governments of Islamic countries to give due importance on harnessing their potentials in human and physical resources to attain social and economic development.

The Muslim world may emerge stronger as powerful economic bloc to shape effectively the new world economic order by exploiting their potentials, the seminar observed.

To improve suitable methods and techniques for human resources development, the experts suggested setting up of a task force to review and analyse the bottlenecks and suggest means for improving.

The seminar urged the governments of the Muslim countries to provide appropriate facilities and incentives for production of expert manpower and development of skills in different disciplines.

A total of nine key-note papers on various aspects of human resources development was presented at the seminar jointly organised by the Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh (IEB) and Federation of Engineering Institutions of Islamic Countries (FEIIC).

Participants at the seminar reviewed the nature and prospect of human resources and technological development of Islamic countries and adopted a 10-point recommendations — the Dhaka Recommendations.

Presided over by Dr Jamilur Reza Chowdhury, President, IEB, the concluding session was addressed among others by Dr S A Hasan, President, FEIIC, Dr Anwar Hossain, Chairman, Organising Committee of the seminar, M A K Azad, General Secretary, IEB, S M Al Hossainy and Dr M A Bishr.

The seminar recommended adequate institutional facilities for training of teachers within the Islamic world and called for more cooperation and coordination among them.

It suggested national efforts and social mobilisation of each Muslim country to eradicate illiteracy within the shortest possible time. It also under-
