

### Madrasah Teachers' Training Institute likely

The government would look into the possibility of establishing a Madrasah Teachers' Training Institute in Dhaka or create such a training facilities in the proposed national university for the madrasah teachers, said Education Minister Barrister Jamrudin Sirceer in the Jatiya Sangsad yesterday, reports BSS.

Replying to a private member's resolution submitted by Moulana Abdus Sobhan of Jamaat-e-Islami, which was moved by Moulana Mufti Abdus Sattar in the absence of Moulana Sobhan, the Education Minister said it was necessary for creating such scopes for the madrasah teachers.

He said at present there were nearly one lakh 50 thousand madrasah teachers in the country who deserved training to become more efficient in their teachings.

Earlier, moving the resolution Moulana Mufti Abdus Sattar argued that the madrasah teachers should be imparted better training and an institute was necessary as early as possible. He also said that his party would even seek help from the middle east countries for the funds to establish the institute if the government failed to provide necessary fund for it.

Moulana Sakhawat Hussain and A M Riasat Ali, both from Jamaat-e-Islami, moved two amendments for establishing the institute immediately.

The fate of the resolution remained undecided as its original mover was absent when the minister concerned requested to withdraw it in view of his assurance.

The education programme of Bangladesh Open University will be telecast from Bangladesh Television at 6-30 pm everyday from tomorrow.

However, the programme will not be telecast on Friday, a press release of Bangladesh Institute of Distant Education (BIDE) said here last night.

### Seminar on administrators' role in democratic states

## 'Civil servants should work to help win popular faith in govt'

State Minister for Establishment Nurul Huda yesterday asked officials at all levels to render services to the people in a manner that helps build up confidence about the government and the administration, reports BSS.

He said like a sick person who expects uninterrupted service from the doctors and the nurses, services of the government officials should be such that a case pending before him or her should be disposed of timely with full earnestness.

The State Minister was inaugurating a seminar on 'Role of administrative service in a democratic state' here at the Bangladesh Civil Service (Administration) Academy. Jointly organised by Bangladesh Civil Service (Administration) Association and the academy, the inaugural session of the day long seminar was presided over by A K M Kamaluddin Chowdhury, member of the Planning Commission and President of the Association.

Nurul Huda urged officials of all services to link up their feelings with responsibility aimed at fulfilling the hopes and aspiration of the people. He said under a democratic set up like the present one, the government servants have a vast responsibility to improve the lot of the masses through increased production and by ensuring their fundamental rights and establishing peace and discipline in the society.

Dr Sadat Hossain, Director General of the Academy, and Badur Rahman, General Secretary of the Association, were among others who spoke at the inaugural session.

A key note paper on the subject was presented by M

Mokammel Haque, member Planning Commission at the first working session. Former Cabinet Secretary Mujibur Huq and S M Ali Editor, The Daily Star, took part in discussion on the paper.

Referring to the role of administrative service, Huda said their job is to provide the elected government with correct data and information and proper advice in taking decision. An elected government and administrative service are complementary to each other in taking decisions and implementing those, he observed.

The State Minister noted that because of expansion of administrative work over the past decades, the main tasks of the administrative service — the administrative and judicial work of maintenance of rule of law and the work of the land administration were neglected. He said unless social security were ensured by maintaining law and order, it won't be possible to attain development. He hoped the officials would be more earnest in establishing rule of law and remove complications in land administration.

Speaking about the good job performed by the government officials during last general elections and after the devastating cyclone, the State Minister said, those proved that any work could be done if it received political support.

Huda said since the government under democratic system is accountable to the people for all their works, the officials must also perform their jobs by avoiding past lapses and should have the attitude of accountability. The

government would only hope that the administration would be dynamic and people to meet the demand of the changed situation, he added.

The State Minister urged officials to formulate and execute necessary plans to resolve the major problems like illiteracy, food deficit and population explosion now being faced by the nation. The government after taking charge, has begun working in that direction, he said.

In his presidential address, Kamaluddin Chowdhury underlined the need for enhancing management competence of the administrators and said efforts should be undertaken to raise their skills and capabilities.

He also called upon the authorities to maintain congenial atmosphere enabling officials discharge their duties with high spirit and there by help maintain law and order in the society.

### SCO demands withdrawal of show cause notices on 2 students

Sarbadolo Chhatra Otkhya (SCO) of Jahangirnagar University yesterday (Thursday) brought out a procession on the campus demanding withdrawal of show cause notice on two of its members.

Earlier, the university authorities issued show cause notice for their alleged involvement in the attack on the residence of Dr Abdulla Hel Bak of Zoology Department on September 9.

Sources said members of the SCO, an alliance of all students' bodies raided the house of Dr Bak following a rumour that some Islamic Chhatra Shibir (ICS) activists were hiding in his residence.

The authorities have demanded proper explanation from Md Yousuf of Geography Department and Zahidul Hoque Khokon of Economics Department by November 10.

SCO leaders in a meeting held after the rally alleged that a vested quarter was trying to pave way for the fundamentalist forces on the campus. Students of the Jahangirnagar University are resisting the Jamaat-Shibir forces from entering the campus since the killing of a student leader Habibur Rahman Kabir in August 89.

Demanding immediate withdrawal of the show cause notice, SCO leaders warned the authority that they would launch action programme if their demands were not met.
