No scope for interest-free loan, Saifur tells JS

Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman last night told the Jaitya Sangsad that there was no scope for providing loan to anybody without interest, reports BSS.

He was replying to a private member's resolution moved by Jamaat member Sheikh Ansar Ali proposing that steps be taken to give interest-free loan to the farmers.

Rejecting the resolution, the Finance Minister said interest free economic system had not been established in the country.

Under the existing system, banks could not extend interest free loan as the banks were to pay interest to the deposi-

Referring to the functioning of the Saudi based Islamic Development Bank (IDB) he said even the IDB charges high rate for loan, though not in the name of interest but in the name of profit
