

BNP voted to power to fulfil basic needs: Huda

Information Minister Nazmul Huda yesterday called upon the people to unitedly build up resistance against the anti-people activities of the opposition for implementing the programme of development and production, reports BSS.

Country without electricity for several hours

The whole country was without electricity for several hours from 1 pm on Saturday due to failure of the national grid line following development of technical problem at Ghorasal 230/132 grid sub-station.

In Dhaka city the power tripped around 1 pm and it was restored at different areas at different times between 3 pm and 8-30 pm.

Power Development sources told BSS that because of the technical problem at the Ghorasal grid sub-station, all major stations of the country failed to function simultaneously resulting in the disruption of power supply between 1 pm and 3 pm. Power supply was restored in phases at different regions from alternative sources from 3 pm.
