**Follow rules of scientific cultivation, CU VC urges farmer**

CHITTAGONG, Nov 13: Prof Rafiqul Islam Chowdhury, Vice Chancellor of Chittagong University, today urged the farmers to strictly follow the rules of scientific cultivation to boost agricultural production of the country, reports BSS.

Addressing the farmers' rally-92 on the university campus as the chief guest, the Vice-Chancellor said the farmers should be imparted modern know-how of cultivation which would give a new sense of direction for economic development of the country.

Held under the auspices of Chittagong University Rural Development Project (CURDP), the rally was presided over by Prof Mohammad Fazle Hossain, and addressed, among others, by Prof Dilwar Hussain, Nurs Saifa of CURDP while Abdus Salam and Abu Sayed spoke on behalf of the farmers.

The scientists of Bangladesh Council for Science and Industrial Research (BCSIR) said through the introduction of the process it was proved to be effective to crops of Taka, without which, million tons of foodgrains specially potato, would have gone rotten.

**'Solar power less expensive'**

Use of infinite solar energy has been suggested for power generation in view of the country's limited fossil fuel reserve and lack of scope for having new hydro-electric power plants, reports BSS.

The solar power will be less expensive in comparison with other conventional energy sources, experts said at a three-day seminar on "The prospects of solar energy in tropical countries" held recently at the Goethe Institute here.

Moreover, solar energy will not pollute the environment and add any harmful agent to worsen the so-called green house effect, they opined.

The experts said, although little work has been done in the country on solar energy field, the significant results achieved abroad on it have paved the way for further initiatives in this regard.

Experts working in Atomic Energy Commission, Dhaka University, Bangladesh Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (BCSIR), Rural Electrification Board and various concerned academic and other institutions participated in the seminar.

Viewing the prospects from their respective fields they said that proper application of solar energy, especially the photovoltaic system (PV system), might effectively solve power supply problem in different areas particularly in the remote places and offshore islands.

According to Engr Nazrul Islam of Rural Electrification Board, PV technology is simple, dependable and can be used on any scale. It is one of the best technologies for meeting widely dispersed power need of rural communities.

Describing different utilities of the system, he said, PV pumping system can provide pure drinking and irrigation water for the rural areas. The PV system can help set up communication network with the distant parts of the country, and effectively provide power for use in the health clinics, vaccine refrigeration, households, schools and community buildings.


