Tk 10.40 Cr Meghna-Dhanagoda embankment project Completed

CHANDPUR, Nov 16: The embankment of Meghna-Dhanagoda irrigation project at the confluence of Meghna and Padma was completed recently at a cost of Taka 10.40 crore, according to an official handout Friday, reports BSS.

Agriculture and irrigation, water development and flood control Minister M Majid Ul Haq Friday visited the embankment site of the irrigation project. State Minister for Establishment Md Nurul Huda, Chairman of WDB M A Razzak and high officials of Water Development Board were present.

The embankment was constructed to protect Meghna-Dhanagoda irrigation project from erosion and wave action of the combined flow at the confluence of Meghna and Padma at Eklaspur.

The construction work of the embankment started in April '91 and completed recently with the financial assistance of ADB. About 35,500 acres of land will come under irrigation facilities and 83000 metric tons of additional crops will be produced per year. The ministers went round
