Armed Forces Day programmes

On the occasion of the Armed Forces Day a grand display of military hardware has been arranged. President Abdur Rahman Biswas will inaugurate the grand exhibition at Sher-e-Bangla Nagar (north western part of the Old Airport area.)

The exhibition will remain open for the members of the public from 1 pm to 5 pm on the day. It will also remain open for public viewing from 8 am to 5 pm from November 22 to November 25.

There will be stalls where equipment, arms, ammunition, vehicles, tanks, aircraft and vessels used by Army, Navy and Air Force will be put on display.

A replica of the BNS Ali Haider, a frigate of the Bangladesh Navy, will also be opened.

Groups of army personnel will stage demonstration of unarmed combat and rivaal divers will take part in exhibition diving while formations of BAF aircraft and helicopters will fly past at low altitude emitting coloured smoke flares.

Shows of documentary films on the War of Liberation in 1971 will also be arranged.

A number of BN ships will also be dressed overall and kept open for visitors at Sadarghat in Dhaka, Narayanganj, Chittagong, Khulna, Barisal and Mongla.

In the evening, Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia will host a reception at the 'Sena Kunja', the multipurpose auditorium and civic complex, at the Dhaka Cantonment to commemorate the day.

Receptions will also be held at Chittagong, Khulna, Jessore, Bogra, Rangpur and Mymensingh and Comilla.

Programmes have also been chalked-out to celebrate the day in a befitting manner in all other army garrisons, naval ships and establishments and airforce bases throughout the country. These include special mu-

najat after the Fajr prayers in all mosques of cantonments, naval ships and establishments and airforce bases throughout the country, special 'Darbar' illustrating the importance of the day in all units, 'Preeti Bhoj' to be attended by officers, JCOs, soldiers, sailors and airmen and members of their families, improved diet in all military hospitals and cinema shows for the soldiers, sailors, airmen and members of their families.

Besides, a special programme illustrating the significance of the day has been arranged in the Bangladesh Television. It will be telecast on November 21 at 9 pm.

Age can't curb his thinking power, weaken spirit

Intellectuals, litterateurs, artists and cross section of people honoured the 105 year old man of success Mohammad Nasiruddin with floral wreaths and with recognition of his works Friday at a function at the National Press Club.

The function attended by hundreds of male and female was organised on the occasion of his 105th birth anniversary.

Nasiruddin, apparently burdened with old age but lively and fresh with juvenile spirit, recalled the days of his youth, when, according to his written speech, the Muslim society would not allow the practice of art, culture, music and even sports.

"I had dreams, and relentless efforts to materialise the dreams" the pioneer journalist-litterateur in the Islamic society of the then Bengal said with deep confidence.

He also recalled a number of personalities of that superstitious era including Kazi Nazrul Islam, Abul Fazal, Begum Rokeya, without whose association and active contribution, he added, the backward Muslim society could not be brought into the light of civilisation.

The function presided over by Begum Sufia Kamal, who was associated with the struggle of the valiant personality since the beginning of this century, was addressed among others by Obaid-ul Huiq, Abdullah Al Muti Sharfuddin.

Dr Anisuzzaman, Rafiqul Islam, Mustafa Noorul Islam, and Khaleda Salahuddin.

Nasiruddin, who assigned Abdullaj Al Muti to read out his written speech because of physical weakness, however, expressed his gratitude for the 'rare' honour and hoped that the struggle for progress and a happy and prosperous society would win.

Obaid-ul Huiq said that even at the age of 105 Nasiruddin was fresh, green and concise. "Age could not curb his (Nasiruddin's) thinking power, snatch away his working capacity and weaken his spirit," Obaid said.

Abdullah Al Muti said that Nasiruddin had become an institution with his works and contributions for the society.

Rafiqul Islam said that he was vocal against communalism and reactionary acts.

Mustafa Noorul Islam said Nasiruddin was the man who lit the torch first for the progress and emancipation of women in the Islamic society of the sub-continent. The women like Begum Rokeya, Shamsunnahar Mahmud and Sufia Kamal come out in the street because of his (Nasiruddin) contribution, the observed.

A musical soiree and recitation of poems followed the function where noted artists of country rendered their songs and poems.
