Uplift plan for Mongla Port dock workers underway MONGLA, Nov 22: A massive huddin MP, Abdul Khaleque

plan has gone underway for development of 41 acres of land allotted for building total infrastructure including residential accommodation, educational institutions, hospital, recreational and other facilities in and around Mongla Port premises for the dock workers of the port, according to an official handout, reports BSS.

This was disclosed at a meeting held here on Friday between Deputy Minister for Shipping A B M Zahidul Haque and six other members of the parliamentary standing committee on Shipping Ministry and dock workers management board authority of Mongla Port.

Six parliamentary standing committee members present on the occasion included Syed Wahidul Alam MP, Begum Selina Rahman MP, MesbaTalukdar MP, Nazir Hossain MP and Advocate Dhirendra Debnath Shambhu MP, Additional Secretary in-Charge of Ministry of Shipping Waliul Islam was also present. Enquired by committee

members about the reasons of unrest among the dock workers hampering normal running of Mongla Port and causing loss of huge revenue earnings, board authority clarified that there were 13 full scale strike calls and nine partly ones since the inception of the management board in 1987.

One of the causes of grievances of the workers was the anormally of facilities between the registered and unregistered workers, the authority said. Besides, there are huge number of workers fully controlled by stevedores association, not by the manage-

Plan to extend credit, services to micro firms

The government plans to provide the micro enterprises with credit and other supporting services with a view to creating employment opportunity for the poor, specially the landless people, according to concerned sources.

International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) and Swiss Development Corporation (SDC) had agreed in principle to provide fund and expertise for the project titled 'Micro Enterprises Development Project (MEDP) the sources said.

A IFAD-SDC Fact-Finding Mission visited Bangladesh in September last to review the project and it would send the report by the end of this month, the sources noted.

The project appraisal mission would come in March next year, they added.

The project will be implemented in two phases and it would cost a total of nine million US dollar 3.5 in the first phase and 5.5 US dollar in the second phase.

In the first phase, the credit and other supporting services would be channeled through five banks and financing institutions. Those are: Bangladesh Small and Cottage . Industries Corporation (BSCIC), Agrani Bank, Bank of Small Industries and Com-(BASIC), Arab Bangladesh Bank and Uttara

Two target groups have been selected for the project. The entrepreneurs who have the skill but not the financial resources and the job seekers. from the poorest families.

The components of the project include, Identification of Entrepreneurs, Training and Institution Building, Credit and Supporting Services and Monitoring and Evaluation.

The unit would be headed by a Project Coordinator, supported by a Monitoring and Evaluation Specialist and it would maintain accounts, compile data and conduct independent checks of all subborrowers.
