Egg, chicken dearer while rice shows downward trend

Price of Indian eggs are on the Indian eggs. A dozen of such as pangas rose to Tk 180 the rise as a result of low sup- Bangladeshi eggs is now selling per kg. at Tk 33 to Tk 36.

"The difference of price inevitably moved the buyers to take Indian eggs," the wholesalers said. The local poultries protested for that and now the supply is low but the local poultries would never lower

the price of their eggs." A wholesaler commented, the local poultries do not think of the buying capacity of the people if there were no Indian egg. You would have had probably bought the Bangladeshi eggs for Tk 40 a dozen."

In Kawran Bazar, sale of Indian eggs was considerable and some of the wholesalers did not even sell any Bangladeshi egg.

"From December, price of Bangladeshi eggs will start to fall," forecasts an egg vendor," because supply of eggs from the villages will increase by

Meanwhile, low supply pushed the prices of chickens further up in the last one week. A small size chicken was sold at Tk 50 to Tk 55 in, Kawran Bazar yesterday, the medium ones from Tk 65 to Tk 70 and the large ones over

In winter, villagers largely depend on paddy and rice for their livelihood and tend to sell less chickens.

Meanwhile, supply of big fishes decreased and supply of cat fishes increased with the coming of winter. The cat fishes are being sold at Tk 90 a kg while price of big fishes

"Pangas is getting as precious as gold nowadays," said one buyer quitting to bargain a pangas. Kai, a fish much loved by the Bengalees, are available in large numbers, but was costly yesterday.

"I sold 20 kai fish this morning for Tk 1200," a fish monger said.

At the rice whole sale market, low price had been steady for over a month. "Only few days ago the price of irri, usually sold for Tk 10 went up by 50 paisa, but that dropped too..." a rice wholesaler said.

The price of fine rice has come down to Tk 32 a kg recently from Tk 35 in a month, due to arrival of new fine rice. "The new fine rice is bad in quality.... it melts in you cooking pot, so buyers are not taking it", rice sellers said. The new fine rice is sold at Tk 23 to Tk 24 a kg.

Meanwhile, paijam is sold at Tk 12.50, jingha sail at Tk 13, Kataribhogh at Tk 18. Prices of all rices fell by Tk one to Tk four a kg due to bumper production of paddy this year.

"But sale is bad this season," rice wholesalers said, "there are temporary rice shops everywhere because it's cheap....and the buyers are going to those shops because they are selling in their neighbourhood.

The rice vendors forecast that the price of rice would not go up with in the next two

Call to produce quality goods to meet global competition

Industries Minister Shamsul Islam Khan Thursday called for producing quality products to compete with foreign imports and producers, leading the world market, reports UNB.

Unless we achieve efficient and dynamic industries, we can hardly attract foreign investment, he said underscoring the need for restructuring public manufacturing enterprises to make them viable.

The minister also called for reducing surplus labour from the enterprises to achieve more cost efficient operations, higher productivity and satisfactory financial performance.

He was addressing a workon "Competitive Productivity and Labour Redundancy Problem in State Owned Enterprises" at Hotel Purbani Thursday morning.

The workshop was addressed, among others, by Labour and Manpower Minster Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan, Industries Secretary Dr Ekram Hossain and Joint Secretary, industries, Afzalur Rahman.

Jointly organised by the Ministry of Industries and Asian Development Bank, the workshop was participated by 28 representatives from various sector corporations, ministries, chamber of commerce and industries and interna-

tional agencies. The main objective of the workshop is to provide advice and guidance to the consul-

tants, necessary to reform public manufacturing sector. The minister said a large number of manufacturing enterprises are under public sector. "But they are not working profitably, consequently it becomes difficult to compete in

the national and international

markets. Shamsul Islam said reduction of surplus labour will reduce the drain on government fund and leave this fund for improvement of other important areas like education,

health and industrial growth. Dwelling at length on the overall situation of country's industrial sector, Labour Minister Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan said many of our manufacturing enterprises in public sector are not achieving the desired financial results.

"But the government can not subsidise the enterprises continuously" he said and called for identifying the causes making continuous loss to the enterprises.

He underscored the need for better supply of raw materials and other inputs, better management and better inservice training.

Power failure causes loss of Tk 2.5 cr in Rajshahi

RAJSHAHI, Nov 26: Frequent loadshedding and power disruptions have caused a loss of about Taka 2.5 crore during last one year in the northern districts of the country, according to an unofficial estimate, reports UNB.

Electric supply came down to about 50 per cent in Bogra circle No 1, Rajshahi circle No 2 and Dinajpur circle No 3. An average of 300 megawatt

of electricity is needed daily in the northern region and less than 150 mw is now being supplied from the Siddirganj

On the other hand, about electric transformers

were damaged and electric supply stopped for about 800 hours in the three circles of the northern region during the

Production in the industries was seriously affected in the area due to frequent load shedding and low voltage. A huge quantity of agricultural produce perished in the cold storages.

Some subscribers said that they had written and contacted the PDB authority for renovation and replacement of the damaged transformers. No response has yet been received, they said.
