Most of the victims are children and women of far flung areas of the district.

The staff of the civil surgeon office however confirmed nine deaths and said at least five hundred other were attacked by the disease. They also said diarrhoea attacked 6554 person in all the thanas over the last two years.

These patients were 892 in Sherpur, 852 in Dupchachia, 854 in Nandigram, 784 in Sadar, 777 in Kahaloo, 559 in Sonatola, 537 in Gabtali, 505 in Shibganj, 446 in Adamdighi 245 in Shariakandi and 112 in Dhunot.


