

Atmosphere for foreign investment created'

CHITTAGONG, Dec 5: Konei Kajikawa leader of the 12 member Investment Survey Mission and Chairman of Nishto Chamber of Commerce and Industry of Japan said here today that a congenial atmosphere for foreign investment had been created by Bangladesh government through its market economy and liberal industrial policy, reports BSS.

Kajikawa was exchanging views with members of Chittagong Chamber of Commerce and Industry at the Chamber House here today.

The Investment Survey Mission is exploring investment opportunity Bangladesh. The mission has already visited Dhaka.

Kajikawa noted with satisfaction that 11 Japanese industrial units had now been set up in the Chittagong Export Processing Zone, while two years back there were only two such units. We see a favourable investment climate in Bangladesh, he added.

The survey mission leaders pointed out that Japan was experiencing some sort of economic recession and as such she would have to recast her foreign investment policy. Japan, he said, would go for increased foreign investment to narrow down its trade gaps with various countries.

He also said that he would be happy to see Bangladesh as a competitive market for investment in South East Asia.

He commended introduction of Dhaka-Nagoya Biman service saying introduction of Chittagong-Tokyo air service would further facilitate expansion of trade relationship between the two countries.

Govt cooperation to run voluntary bodies urged

Code of ethics for newsmen should not be dictated

Minister, politician and journalists in a seminar Saturday said that there should be a code of ethics for the journalists but it should not be dictated by the government.

A code of ethics can ensure objectivity of newspapers as well as press freedom but if the government formulate that ethics there are possibilities of government control over the newspaper industry.

Nazmul Huda, Awami League General Secretary Zillur Nirmal Scn, Secretary General of Bangladesh Federal Union of (TSC).

Prof Sakhawat Ali Khan presented the key-note paper at the seminar organised by Dhaka University Journalist Association (DUJA) Acting Vice-chancellor of the University Emajuddin Ahmed chaired the seminar.

Some of the speakers said that most of the newspapers were not following the basic norms of journalism like objectivity and credibility. Some blamed mushroom growth of newspapers for not following even the unwritten ethics drawn by the newspapermen.

Prof Khan in his paper said that so far there was no code of ethics for the journalists in our country. Most of the journalists mostly new comers followed their seniors to learn
