According to International Labour Laws, the children below the age group of 15 are not allowed to take up hard work. But in our country, the law is not being enforced. The concerned authorities have been urged to take initiatives to rehabilitate the child labourers through opening institutions and thus help them enjoy the minimum rights for the greater interest of the national Some of the children informed this correspondent

that none of them had a single piece of cultivable land. Most of these families consist of seven to ten members. Still, a few of them have not given up the hope of going to
