Referring to the vast and multi-dimensional problems of environmental protection, resource conservation and sus

Noman said Bangladesh was suffering from serious environmental vulnerability due to its geographical location on the lower riparian of the major river systems and watersheds apart from natural calamities deforestation, loss of soil quality, salinity intrusion and pollu-

Presided over by the president of the society Prof M A Aziz Khan the inaugural session was also addressed by Prof Emajuddin Ahmed, Prof M Ashraf Ali Khan and Prof M Anisur Rahman, Vice-chancel lors of Dhaka, Mymensingh Agricultural and Rajshahi Universities respectively and secretary of the society Dr Abdul Aziz.

The Environment Minister said Bangladesh had taken concerted action programmes to arrest resource depletion

and environmental degradation. He said Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia had given a clarion call to the nation to plant at least one tree by each individual every year

Prof Emajuddin Ahmed urged the botanists to make specific suggestions so that these could be useful to the academicians, the politicians as well as the professional

Prof Ashraf Ali Khan said efficient land use could be made through agro-forestry. He said 100 million date plants could be grown on road sides in Bangladesh for which motivation of the people was needed

Prof Anisur Rahman laid emphasis on biological control of insects for a better environment. Stressing the need for research on plant and plant products he said we should not neglect plants as it would be equivalent to neglecting our-

In his presidential speech, Prof Abdul Aziz Khan said plants are the last frontier to save mankind and the earth from destruction.

Extensive plantation and afforestation programme is the first step to solve some of the environmental problems the world in general and Bangladesh in particular is facing now, he added.

He said forest area in Bangladesh was about 25 per cent before 1947, which had been reduced to seven per cent in the last 45 years. Bangladesh had 0.09 hectare of forest area per head while it is one per cent per head on an average in the world.
