US marines swoop on military airbase

MOGADISHU, Dec 13: More than 200 US Marines swooped a military airbase in Somalia's interior today to secure it for the US-led armed intervention to get food to the starving, a spokesman said.

It was the Marines' first thrust into Somalia's lawless and famished interior -since they reached the capital on Wednesday

Marine Lieutenant Colonel Fred Peck said 230 Marines had taken off from Mogadishu in 12 helicopters, with an escort of Cobra helicopter gunships, to secure the airfield at Bali Dogle, about 160 km (100 miles) from the capital.

Bali Dogle is likely to be used as a staging post to secure relief operations for Baidoa, dubbed Somalia's 'City of Death.

Peck said the Marines had taken food supplies with them to Bali Dogle after receiving reports that large numbers of Somalias had gathered there waiting to hand in their weapons.

French President Francois Mitterrand announced late on Saturday that his country would ask the United Nations to authorise enforcement of the no-fly zone over Bosnia.

Mitterrand's statement at a news conference followed an announcement by US Secretary of State Lawrence Eagleburger that the outgoing Bush administration was now also ready to back use of force against Serbian aircraft violating the no-fly zone.

The French move went further than the EC summit ending on Saturday, which mentioned violations of the no fly zone and said the UN Security Council should examine the situation in the light of its Resolution 786 of October ! which provided for possible enforcement.

Ministers said Serbia's leadership and the Bosnian Serbs shred primary responsi bility for the war in Bosnia. A separate part of the text

said, "the (summit) is appalled by the systematic detention and rape of Muslim women. It strongly condemns these acts of unspeakable brutality, which form a deliberate strategy to terrorise the Muslim community in Bosnia."

The ministers said those responsible for atrocities would be brought to justice and urged the immediate closure of all detention camps, especially those for women.

The draft said dame Anne Warburton, 65, d former British ambassador and now president of a Cambridge college, would be sent to investigate cases of rape. Irish diplomats said Irish Foreign Minister David Andrews would go also.

The summit text said Serbian authorities bore equal responsibility for fomenting the conflict and failing to use their influence to curb it.

The ministers said more action was needed to protect civilians in Bosnia through the development of safe areas, and by providing refuge in EC member states for particularly vulnerable categories o

People serving in any post of profit, contractors, suppliers and dealers appointed by concerned pourashavas as well as bank defaulters have also been barred from contesting the elections. One cannot contest for

commissioner and chairman posts at the same time or for more than one post of commissioner. Nomination papers of all

candidates who fall short of fulfilling the requisite merits will be cancelled.
