

Rabbi shoots for new mark

The shooting competition of the fifth Bangladesh Games got underway at the Gulshan Range

yesterday with Fazle Elahi Rabbi of Bangladesh Ansars setting a new record in the men's match air pistol event. Rabbi shot a score of 581 out of a possible 600, 16 points higher than the existing mark.

Atcegur Rahman of Gulshan Shooting Club and Saiful Islam Chowdhury settled for the stlver and bronze with scores of 564 and 561 respectively. The other — and more fa-

mous Ateeq in the fray -Commonwealth Games and SAF Games gold medallist Atcequr Rahman of Chittagong Metropolitan Shooting Club, claimed the gold medal in the free pistol event with a not-soimpressive total of 533 points. Ateeg's closest challenger Abdus Sattar Nini who partnered Ateeq in landing the Commonwealth Games gold medal in Auckland a couple of years ago, managed a score of only 506 to earn Gulshan Shooting Club another silver. Apparently, Nini's long absence from home for the past several months has obviously affected his aim with his favourite weapon.

Haider Ali Babu o Chittagong Rifle Club got the bronze with a score of 504.

Another star who lived up to her top billing was Kazi Shahana Parveen, a SAF Games gold medallist and the first female Olympian of the country. In the only women's event of the day Shahana claimed the gold with a score of 375 out of 400 in the women's match air

Shahana's younger sister and teammate Ferdous Parveen gave a good chase for the glittering prize but failed by the thin margin of two points, her score of 373 earning her the silver. Farzana Hossain Shoma won the bronze with a score of 369.



Winter, a black soccer player from the Netherlands, received a rude welcome when he joined the

Italian league this year, reports "Winter raus." German for Winter get out," was scrawled on the walls of the offices of his team - Lazio of Rome, Villa Borghese park and other areas of the Italian capital. A few days later, the team president

was mailed a swastika. in a year in which racial intolerance and ethnic tensions are sweeping Europe, Winter and other black players in Italy have been the targets of taunts from the stands, where groups of skinheads, known in Italy as "naixkins," wave Nazi banners. They also sing anti-Jewish songs and make the stiffarmed fascist salute.

Racism in European stadiums seems mainly an Italian problem, according to an informal survey by Associated

larly worrisome in Italy, with
