## 'Nakshi Kanthas' With Refreshing Patterns

There was a time when nakshi kantha was a woman's pastime, a way to recycle and decorate old clothing. Now the ubiquitous nakshi stitch haunts every handicraft shop in sight. Inevitably, a lot of it is sloppy and unoriginal.

That's why the collection currently on display at the Goethe Institute in Dhanmondi is refreshing. Based mainly on sarees and some shalwar kameez, the exhibition is presented by an organization with the somewhat cryptic name of Henry's Heritage. The craftsmanship is nearly flawless, and the designs have flair and originality.

A lot of traditional motifs are flung about, especially the fish, the kalka, and leafy designs, but the colour combinations are urbane and modern. Most of the nakshi work is done by women in Sherpur, under the guidance of Razia Samad, a designer. She organizes the women, many of whom had the skills previously but lacked the funds and marketing knowledge to make their work financially profitable.

This particular collection has the distinction of presenting unique pieces: no two items are exactly the same in stitching or in

Nakshi stitching on shalwar kameez. cushions and bedspreads has a much larger appeal than on sarees, where the stitch tends to look a bit out of place. But as more and more buyers wear nakshi kantha sarees, this might well become a new trend, a break from traditional jamdani. If handicrast entrepreneurs develop a large enough network to export sarecs to neighbouring countries, the market potential is enormous, judging from the number of tourists who load their suitcases with kantha stitch sarees.




