

Rajshahi tense: Sec 144 extended

RAJSHAHI, Dec 26: Authorities today extended the enforcement of Section 144 till December 31 in certain arcas of the metropolitan city due to a tense situation, reports UNB.

A number of butchers slaughter animals in dirty places and supply meat to markets without the needed quality check by City Corporation officials, they said. According to the 1957 Meat

Quality Control Law and the 1983 City Corporation, Ordinance, a butcher should slaughter the animals in an authorised slaughter house and then take the meat to markets after getting the quality seal from a veterinary surgeon.

A large number of meat sellers do not follow the rules and sell beef and mutton at dingy roadside shops or even
