



SEOUL, Dec 27: South Korca's Barcelona marathon gold medalist Hwang Young-Cho said today that he would not retire after all, reports


Hwang, 22, had told a press conference Friday on returning from Japan where he had undergone a month of treatment for a foot injury that he was quitting marathon running.
