Although electronics is considered as a thrust sector by the government, little attention has been given to develop it through concerted

During the last 30 years, the most of the activities in this sector remained limited to assembling of radio, cassette players and televisions with imported components in CKD conditions.

Since the 80s, a number of entrepreneurs, technocrats and scientists took initiative in setting up a few electronics units through development of electronics devices like light dimmers, fan regulators, calling bells, voltage regulators, unrestricted power supplies equipments, medical electron-



BOGRA, Dec 28: Out of 27 these buses back on roads. buses, only seven are in run-Repairing to some extent is ning condition at the government bus depot (Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation, BRTC) here for a long time. Such condition has been prevailing in the absence of proper maintehance and lack of administrative command. Established in 1969 at

Officials informed that most of the buses lying at the depot could be put into operation if spare parts were available. However, no such decisions to repair these buses were made during last few months.

The officials further informed that an estimated Taka three lakh is required to put

possible here at the depot.

Twelve mechanics are employed to help in such work. However, no such workshop is available for major repairing. Buses badly damaged are sent. to Dhaka depot for repairing.

Samatha, this depot only served Bogra to Dhaka route buses. With increasing demand, the depot expanded its services to other northern districts. In 1982, these routes were suspended for reasons not known and were resumed

sufferings. "Forwardings were sent several times but only reconditioned buses arrived to réplace the old, damaged ones in place of new buses," it is

Similarly, the truck division of the depot suffer almost the same condition as the case with the bus depot.

It was informed that about Taka 60 lakh is lost by the truck division every year. Almost half the trucks of the division are in operation. Out of 44 trucks, 24 now are in

running condition. The rest are lying at the depot.

Official sources say that about four lakh taka is required to put these damaged trucks back on roads. But no such response come from the head office at Dhaka. Several letters were sent to bring attention of the authorities. Though mechanics and spare parts were

sent but only in small number. The existing trucks serving different routes are also in bad shape. Minor repairing is done at the depot but when major damages occur like accidents or breakdown, trucks have to watt a long time before head office signals for repairing at Dhaka workshop.
