 The final of the Victory Day Cricket championship for the 1992-93 cricket season, between holders Abahani Krira Chakra and Mohammedan Sporting Club starts this morning at the Dhaka Stadium. An eighty-overs a side affair, the clash between the arch-rivals will be played over two days.
 Abahani entered the final with a huge 209 run victory against the Greater Mymensingh Cricket Club (GMCC) while Mohammedans earned a passage with a 22-run victory against strong Brothers Union Monday.
 Agricultural Minister Major General (ret'd) Majid-ul-Huq will give away the prizes as the chief guest tomorrow.
 Meanwhile, the Bangladesh Cricket Control Board (BCCB) has fixed the rates of tickets for the final match. VIP Gate No 1 ticket will cost Tk 100, Gate No 3A Tk 50, Gate No 3 B Tk 30, eastern and western galleries Tk 10.
 The brief cricket tournament comprising four semifinals of this year's Dama Summer cricket final began on December 19 rightaway from the semifinal stage.

Windies have an uphill task ahead

MELBOURNE, Dec 29: Rookie Damien Martyn scored an unbeaten 67 Tuesday as Australia tightened their grip on the fourth day of the second cricket Test against the West Indies at the Melbourne Cricket Ground, reports AP.
 At stumps, the West Indies were 32 for one wicket in their second innings, chasing a victory target of 359 on a deteriorating wicket.
 Martyn, playing in his second Test handled the West Indies, pace attack and the crumbling pitch far better than any of his teammates.
 Martyn's first Test half-century saved Australia from a dismally low second innings total. The Australians eventually were shot out for 196 in their second innings after leading by 162 runs on the first.
 The only other notable innings was a dogged 42 by left-handed opener Mark Taylor, while first innings century-makers Mark Waugh and captain Allan Border both were dismissed cheaply.
 Waugh managed only 16 in an hour at the crease, while Border was dismissed for four.
 Martyn top scored and was well supported by tailenders Merv Hughes (15) and Mike Whitney (13), with whom he shared partnerships of 33 and 29 respectively.
 Ian Bishop was the most successful of the West Indies bowlers with three for 45, while Courtney Walsh, Phil Simmons and Curtly Ambrose took two wickets apiece.
 Keith Arthurton left the field midway through the second session after injuring his right thumb when he stopped a crashing off-drive by Martyn while fielding at cover.
 Arthurton is expected to be able to bat on Wednesday, final day of the contest.
 Haynes was out for five to

leave West Indies on nine runs for one wicket, with their main hope to hang on for a draw on the final day of the game at the Melbourne Cricket Ground.

With 13 overs to go to the close, paceman Merv Hughes forced off-form Haynes to edge a catch to keeper Ian Healy.

At the close, captain Richie Richardson was undefeated on 12 in partnership with Phil Simmons, not out 14.

West Indies now need 327 runs to win on a dry wicket which is cracking and causing the occasional erratic bounce.

with a strokeful 78-ball 61 punctuated by seven fours and a six before being run out. Nasir, the Ganadaria skipper, played a subdued innings of 38 in 57 balls, inclusive of six fours.
