Husband gets life-term for killing wife

Md Abdul Hakim Mandal, Additional District and Sessions Judge and Special Tribunal Judge-2, Sirajganj, in a judgement delivered recently, awarded life-term rigorous imprisonment and fine amounting to Taka 5000 in default more one years' rigorous imprisonment to one Abdus Salam (32) for killing his pregnant wife. Other five accused persons were acquitted of the charge.

According to the prosecution, victim Tara Banu (20) was married to convicted Abdus Salam of village Baromohan in Ullapara thana only two years ago. Following continuous torture in demand of dowry Tara Banu came to her father's house and lodged a case with the court of Ullapara Thana Magistrate under Womans' Oppression and Anti-dowry Act. On the night of April 4, 1991, accused Abdul Salam killed wife Tara Banu who was conceiving for seven months.

After examining the witnesses and evidences, the learned judge awarded aforesaid punishment to Abdus Salam. The other five persons were acquitted of the charges.
