# Saifur signals beginning of an expansionary credit programme

Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman signalled the beginning of an expansionary bank credit and leading policy to stimulate further the national economy for attaining high growth, reports BSS.

Rahman was initiating a three hour long threadbare discussion with the directors of nationalised commercial and private banks and specialise financial institutions representing the government, Thursday at the conference room of the ministry.

The minister said now there existed a very solid and sound macroeconomic framework in the country as the present democratically elected government of Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia had undertaken a number of measures to bring back financial discipline.

State Minister for Finance Mojibur Rahman , Bangladesh Bank Governor Khorshed Alam, board of investment chairman Mostafizur Rahman, Deputy Governor Mahmudul Amin Khan, Tarrif Commission Chairman Dr Mohiuddin Khan Alamgir, Additional Secretaries Dr Tawfiq Elahi, Dr Shah Md Farid, Dr Afzalur Rahman, Dr Mamunur Rashid, Abdul Muyced Chowdhury, Dr Akbar Ali Khan, Dr ATM Shamsul Huda and Dr MA Mubin also spoke at this top level meet-

The Finance Minister repeatedly asked these bureaucrat bank directors to held expedite and revitalise the entire banking sector and said the banks had been found to be inadequate in taking prompt decisions with respect to a large number of loan applications from new entrepreneurs.

Rahman directed them to fully exhort their authority so that the banks could implement the present government's policies of enlarging the investment base by attaining the credit and term lending targets.

The Finance Minister said the economic agenda should get top priority in the Board of Directors meeting of the bank and financial institutions.

Quoting figures of excess liquidity in different banks, Rahman said the money was lying idle while a large number of genuine entrepreneurs, industrialists and farmers were denied of granting credits for their productive activities.

He pointed out that a class of entrepreneurs with high quality of skills, efficiency and education had emerged in the country but the banks were non-responsive to their growing demands of credit.

'Try to help them,' the Finance Minister asked them adding 'don't treat a good investor and a bad investor on the same footing.

Detailing the present governments banking policy in the context of the socio-economic realities of the country. the Minister asked them to remove the symptoms of inactions in the banking sector.

"Go and find out good entrepreneurs, provide them with credits. Stop rent seeking and remove corruptions from the banking sector," he asked eous process.



He said the siltation carried out by the rivers Brahmaputra and Padma are being obstructed by the structures hampering our agricultural productions as well as building up of new islands.

"Our forests are in danger, wild species and medicinal plants are disappearing due to massive deforestation," he said urging the SAARC countries to take measures in this regard.

The BAS president said the sea level is increasing, but no research was done on how the ocean is reacting and the monsoon wind is changing.

Emphasising the need for introduction a science policy and establishment of a ministry of science, he said that there are a lot of scientists in the country, but not any scientific community. No integrated programme is there for the development of human resources due to absence of proper planning," he added.

# SAARC chamber formed
