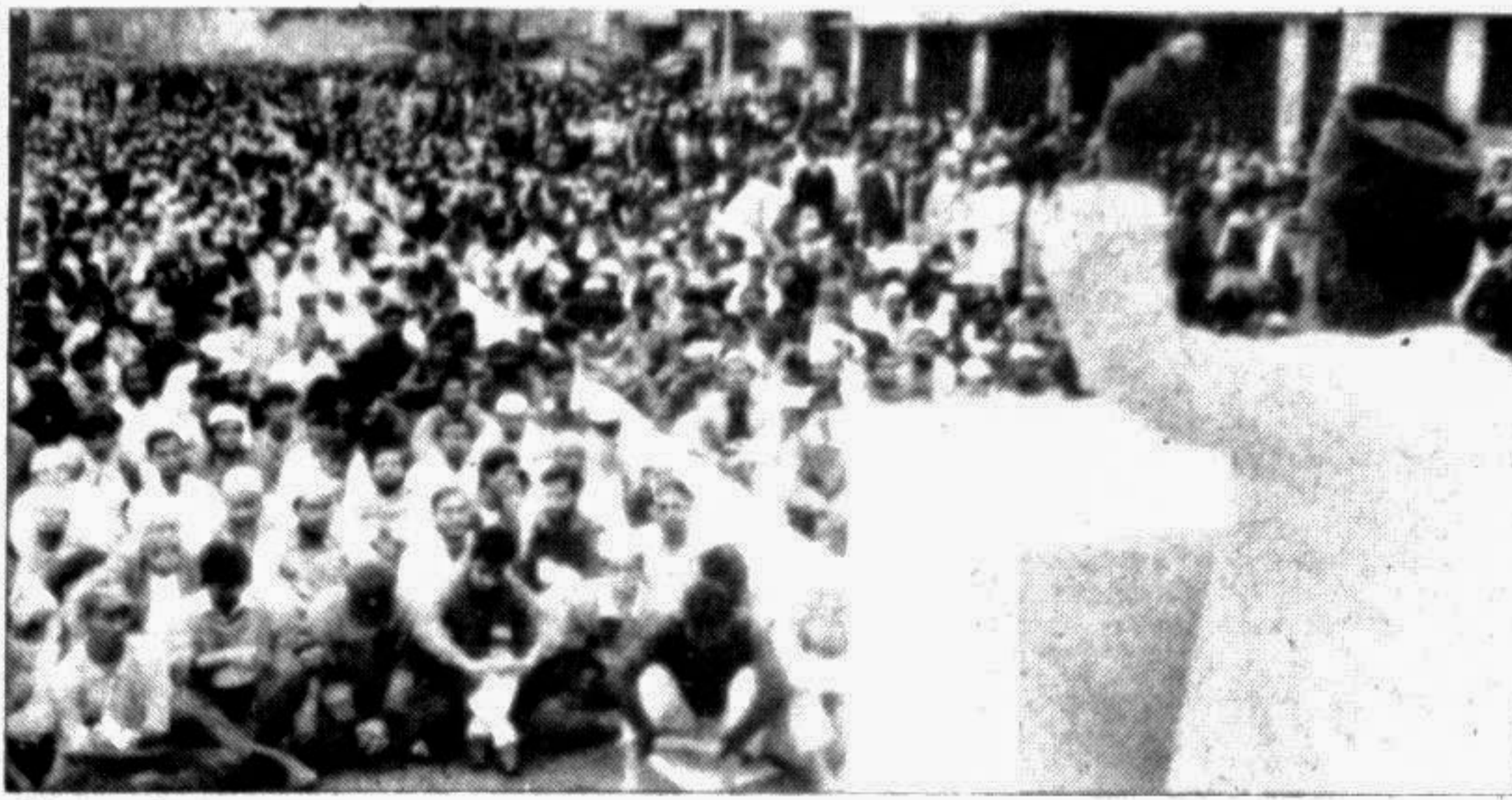

Second annual scientific confce begins

ICDDR,B hospitals prevent 25,000 deaths from diarrhoea a year

Health and Family Welfare Minister Chowdhury Kamal ibne Yusuf yesterday said that the International Centre for Diarrhoeal Disease Research, Bangladesh (ICDDR,B) hospitals at Mohakhali in Dhaka and Matlab in Chandpur district had been preventing at least 25,000 deaths from diarrhoeal diseases every year by providing services to about 100,000 patients, reports BSS.

Inaugurating the three-day second annual scientific conference of ICDDR,B here, the Minister said these hospitals were now an integral and irreplaceable part of the nation's health care system.

He said in the last 12 years the ICDDR,B had trained over 10,000 Bangladeshi health professionals and developed a cadre of dedicated scientists and health professionals.

Held at recently completed Sasakawa International Training Centre of ICDDR,B at Mohakhali the inaugural session was also addressed by Health Secretary Syed Ahmed, US Ambassador William B. Milam, UNICEF representative in Bangladesh Dr Rolf C. Carriere, ICDDR,B Director Professor Demisse Habte and conference Organising Secretary Zia Uddin Ahmed.

The theme of this year's conference is "Health research and policy perspectives."

An annual lecture has also been introduced in the conference from this year. Prof. William B. Greenough III, ICDDR,B's former director and a professor of medicine at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine in the United States delivered this year's lecture on "a simple

solution". Dr Rolf Carriere said health and nutrition education programme has failed all over the world as the programme planners considered "human behaviour as too easy to understand and manage." He said UNICEF also share its part of this blame.

He said the budget for interpersonal communication and promotion of diarrhoeal disease management as well as social marketing of oral therapy was inadequate and did not sustain.

He said some doctors still were not convinced about Oral Rehydration Solution (ORS) and some did not care about it, although, without controlling diarrhoeal diseases world goal to overcome malnutrition by the year 2000 could not be achieved.

Health Secretary Syed Ahmed said the relationship of Bangladesh with ICDDR,B was "very steady", now and would continue to be so in future.

He suggested strengthening of health education to motivate the people to use safe water for all household purposes to prevent diarrhoeal diseases.

Ambassador Milam said on million lives were being saved every year by using ORS all over the world where one in every three families in the developing world use ORS. He said the US government was proud to be able to support the research centre since it originated as a cholera research laboratory in 1960.

Prof Greenough in his lecture on "a simple solution" said Oral Rehydration Therapy (ORT), a solution based on rice and other starchy food, developed by ICDDR,B, deserved to be a part of health care in all countries rich and poor as its efficacy was proved by applying in different settings around the world.

He said ORT was the best therapy for diarrhoea in any setting which was simple and inexpensive.

Prof Greenough cautioned that any possible confusion of food-based oral rehydration with feeding should be avoided as no solutions for ORT provide adequate total nutrition to those affected either during or after diarrhoea.

The conference also had a symposium on "Diarrhoeal disease" which was chaired by the Associate Director, Community Health, ICDDR,B Dr R. Bradley Sack.

The symposium was followed by paper presentations on "nutrition during diarrhoea".

The conference will have two symposia today on "Population and Family Planning" and "Maternal and Child Health Nutrition" followed by paper presentation sessions.

Sultan Uddin Ahmed dead

A prominent freedom fighter Sultan Uddin Ahmed died here at a city clinic last morning. He was 55, reports BSS.

Ahmed, who was one of the accused of the historic Agartala Conspiracy Case, was suffering from cancer, says a press release of the Council for the Accused of the Agartala Conspiracy Case.

During the War of Liberation Sultan Uddin Ahmed played a heroic role and performed the responsibility of camp commander of Bakulia under Sector 9.

Ahmed, left behind his mother, wife, one son and a daughter.

He was buried at the Freedom Fighters Graveyard at Mirpur.
