**Plea to declare southern region as diarrhoea-affected zone**

A voluntary organisation yesterday called upon the government to declare the southern part of the country as diarrhoea-affected zone where, it claimed, nearly 1500 people had died in a fortnight, reports UNB.

The Committee for Prevention of Diarrhoea in Southern Region, at a press conference here, said another 25,000 people in the region were suffering from diarrhoea which has erupted in an epidemic in southern districts.

It said at least 271 died in Mathbaria thana, 152 in Pithargata, 187 in Barguna sadar, 111 in Morelganj, 55 in Sarankhola, 87 in Bhandaria, 27 in Banna, 86 in Khepupara, 44 in Bagerhat sadar, 45 in Nesarabad, 22 in Pirojpur sadar, 74 in Kalapara, 53 in Amtali, 35 in Patuakhali sadar and 27 in Rajapur thana.

Marketing of perished sea fish and sale of unwholesome foods in restaurants and hotels, drinking of polluted water and hanging latrines on canals were cited as main causes of diarrhoea in this zone.

Dr Obaydul Hlaq Khan, Member Secretary of the committee, read out a statement while its Convenor Sharif MA Mannan, Nasiruddin Ahmed, Abdus Salam Asadi, Ali Reza Haider, Advocate Hafizur Rahman and former UP Chairman Mohiuddin Ahmed were, among others, present in the press conference.

They pointed out hundreds of people were dying every year in the region owing to absence of permanent diarrhoea prevention activity by the government.

The committee said the government had not taken necessary steps to contain the present scourge of diarrhoea. Effective medicine, RV saline and expert physicians were the crying need for the diarrhoea-plagued areas, they said and demanded immediate supply.

The committee urged the government and international agencies to take necessary steps to tackle the serious situation.

One-third of the deaths in the age range of 18-36 months in rural Bangladesh are attributed to lack of breastfeeding, said Prof Talukdar, a noted child specialist.

He said breastfeeding is a magnificent example of disease control, caring practices and food security. The high mortality and disease load of children are largely preventable.

**Breast-fed child less susceptible to dying of diarrhoea**

A breast-fed child has 25 times and 4 times less chance of dying of diarrhoea and acute respiratory tract infection respectively than one who is bottle-fed, reports UNB.

This was disclosed by Project Director of the Institute of Child and Mother Health Prof M Q K Talukdar on the second day yesterday of the 2nd annual scientific conference of ICDDR,B.

One-third of the deaths in the age range of 18-36 months in rural Bangladesh are attributed to lack of breastfeeding, said Prof Talukdar, a noted child specialist.

He said breastfeeding is a magnificent example of disease control, caring practices and food security. The high mortality and disease load of children are largely preventable.

Studies have shown that the development of lactation management skills of healthcare providers in hospitals has had a positive impact on breastfeeding practice, he added.

Although the country has a unique primary healthcare infrastructure, he said, it was yet to launch and implement all the important programmes across the country to achieve the goal of 'Health for All by the Year 2000'.

He said Acute Respiratory tract Infection (ARI) programmes seemed to be a priority considering the study finding that the combination of specific and nonspecific interventions can reduce acute lower respiratory tract infection mortality by 50 per cent and overall mortality among children less than 5 years old by 30 per cent.

Prof Talukdar said low-cost health and nutrition 'package' interventions in the community had shown mortality in children reduced drastically.
