BNP pledge-bound to politics of people's welfare: Oli

Communications Minister Oli Ahmad has said, BNP is pledge-bound to stick to the politics of peoples welfare. It did never betray with the interest of the people, nor it will, he added, reports BSS.

The minister was addressing a big public meeting at Chapal Hifzul madrasa ground yesterday, in the Chapal Nawabganj district.

Besides, about Taka 10 crore would be spent for development, maintenance and widening of nine roads of the district including Rajshahi-Chapal Nawabganj highway.

Among others, Syed Manzoor Hussain MP, BNP leaders Sultanul Islam Mont, Golam Zakaria, Abdul Wahed, Abdul Hannan, Farid Ahmed and chairman-candidate in the municipal election Qumrul Ahsan also addressed the meeting.

Lecture on Buddhism

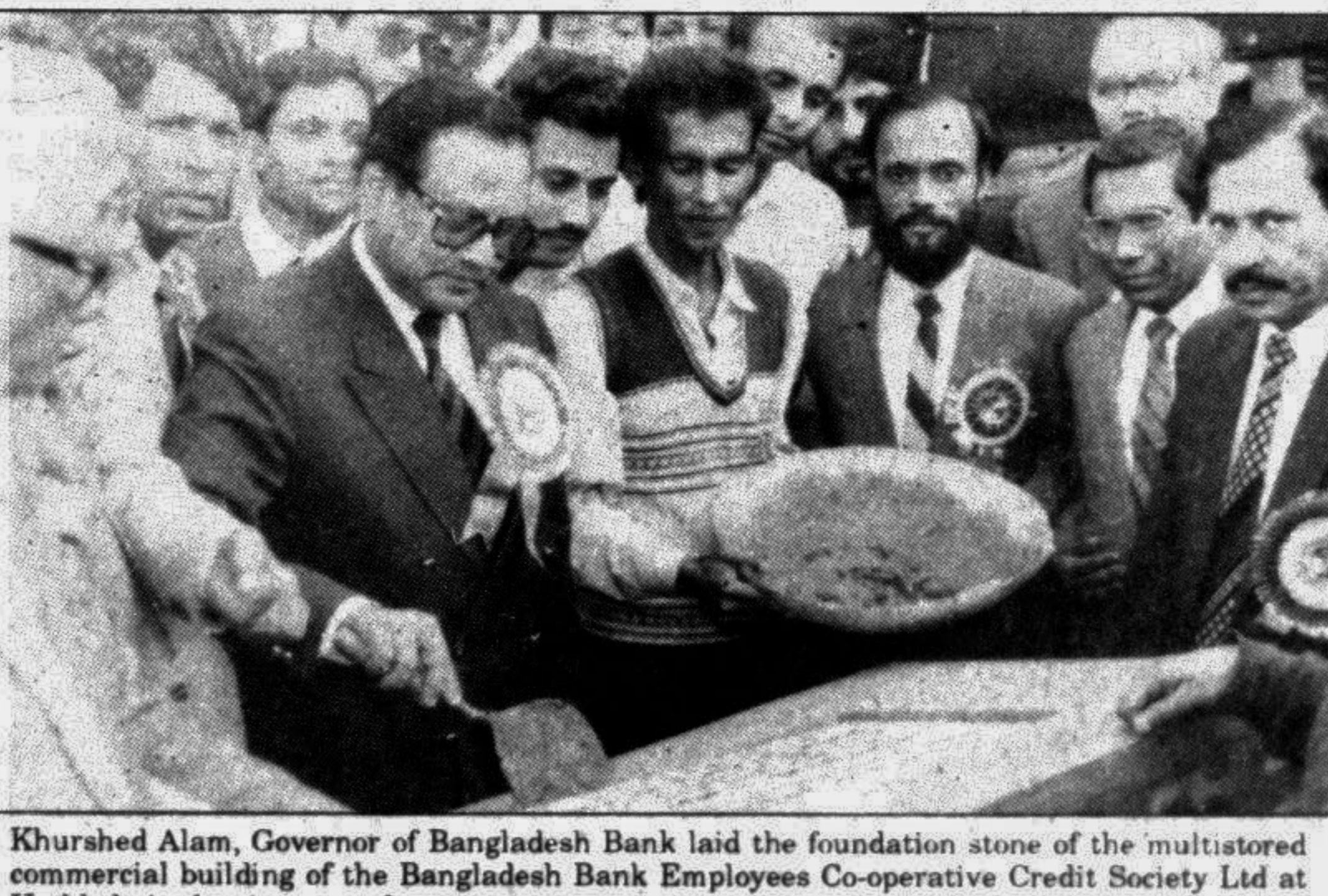
The significance of Buddhism as a religion based on scientific approach was emphasized at a religious discussion here Friday.

1,36,885 hectares devoured by river erosion, JS told

Nearly 1,36,885 hectares of land across the country were devoured by river erosion in last more than 21 years.

This was stated in parliament by Agriculture and Irrigation Minister Major Gen (Rtd) Majid-ul Haq replying to a question from Shahjahan Chowdhury (Ctg-14) yesterday, reports UNB.

The Minister said this figure was based on the information supplied by Water Development Board and various project offices under his ministry.

In reply to Khan Tipu Sultan (AL), Haq told the House that Tk 4607.48 crore had been spent on different projects in flood control, drainage and irrigation sectors during the period from 1971-72 to 1991-93.

During this period, he said the works of 323 out of 424 projects of sub-projects were completed.

French envoy meets Keramat

The Ambassador of France in Bangladesh Jean-Michel Lacombe called on Post and Telecommunication Minister M Keramat Ali at his secretariat office yesterday, reports UNB.

They discussed matters of mutual interest and hoped that the existing relations between the two countries would be further strengthened in the coming years.
