England to host the Cup, are worried the two founding members of the Infernational Cricket Council (ICC) will veto the sub-continent's bid. Inderjit Singh Bindra, joint convenor of the sub-continent's Cup committee, said Thursday the ICC had written

to him that England and Australia are "Not willing to forego the veto powers on the World Cup bid Issue." "But if we win the bid and then are vetoed, then I can assure you England cannot hold the World Cup either," Bindra told AFP during the second

one-day international between India and England here. The venues of the previous two Cups - India and Pakistan in 1987 and Australia and New Zealand in 1991 - were decided by simple majority, and Bindra wants the procedure

followed again. "We are assured of 25 of the 37 votes at the upcoming meeting," he said, but deelined to reveal which countries will support the subcontinent's bid.

According to the ICC constitution, the nine Test playing nations - India, Pakistan, Shri Lanka, South Africa, England, Australia, New Zealand, West Indies and Zimbabwe - have two votes each. The 19 associate members have one each. Zimbabwe, who became a

Test playing nation last year on India's recommendation, have publicly supported the sub-continent's bid But West Indies, Australia

and New Zcaland said they will support England, who hosted the first three Cups in 1975, 1979 and 1983. Bindra, who will accompany

Indian Cricket Board chief Madhavrao Scindia and joint convenor Jagmohan Dalmiya for the London meeting, added the sub-continent's bid was better than England.

"Our bid is to the tune of five million pounds, while England's is around 4.85 million pourids. We are safe in that respect," he said
