Potholes and the Hardship Syndrome



It gives us immense delight to sit back and hear the enlightened class narrate the 'hardships' of Dhaka. Dhaka, this gorgeous, noisy, polluted, dirty, dear city of ours is more often than not termed as the 'hardship posting' by the sophisticated majority. Marvellous description, we mutter sardonically to ourselves.

And never more than when we are bumping along those bumpy roads, so desperately spruced up for the Summit, which unfortunately fell on such hard times. Summit or not, the roads will hardly be recognizable now for the next three months or so. Then of course we are all back to square one till the next Summit. We hope. But till then perhaps the description of the 'hardship posting' can be changed to a 'tolerable posting' by the enlightened elite? Surely even they cannot complain when we are so spruced up and shiny?

We wonder at times if there is any sense in pointing out the merits of the city to the superior being busy describing it as the 'hardship training ground. In spite of our faults and hardships we have our positive sides too. How else can we describe the ability of the potholes to disappear so miraculously come Summit time to reappear immediately afterwards? The potholes have their merits too, of course. No other 'hardship posting' gives the long suffering, whining multitudes such valid reasons to whine and grieve. The fact that they can so easily forget all the positive sides of the city is always cause for great wonder. Somehow, the potholes seem to be foremost in their minds when they refer to the 'hard points' of the place. What other reason can anybody have for calling this delightful city, such harsh names? The power situation is quite tolcrable as

even the most critical will admit. Actually, the electric authorities deserve a resounding pat on the back for a credible performance. The water position may not be enviable but will suffice. But the suffering hordes, who are always grumbling about the 'hardship posting' certainly do not face these ordinary problems. In fact, in more candid moments they will probably admit to themselves that they have never had it so good. The 'hardship' bit is the facade they have to maintain to keep the extra allowance coming in and the 'R&R' ensured. Marvellous tactics, these.

Here we are, innocently presuming it is the potholes which make them unhappy; whereas all the time they have their wee brains working overtime to ensure their comfort. Clever. But coming back to the potholes, some big enough to accommodate a boat, will now be tolerable with the winter here. Gorgeous time of the year, winter for us. Even the 'hardship wallas' admit that. Potholes or not they cannot hide their euphoria at the gorgeous blue skies and endless sunshine. Much cheaper to lap it up here than make that trip to the Bahamas or the south of France. Quite compensates for the miseries of the place, they will whisper perhaps amongst themselves.

It is only the likes of us who will take the city for what it is worth, potholes and all. For nowhere else do we feel as comfortable as when we are bumping along the pothole bequeathed city roads, cursing, laughing and thoroughly enjoying ourselves as only the Dhakaite can in this 'hardship' place. The ones who cannot enjoy the joys of the city perhaps descrie our compassion. They are certainly missing out on a lot.


