brother's birthday. She ended up with a "gameha" type material because of her lack of knowledge of the texture of the "lungi" materi-

als, and as she can be eastly gulled. Whenever a lady has to buy items for birth days, marriages, anniversaries, "aqiqas", or oc Should the lady have the gumption, and is casions of congratulations for a new-born baby, a knowledgeable friend on confidante must be roped in. This maybe difficult when a lady's friends might all be working beyond 6 p.m.

She maybe well aware of all the vegetable, meat, and clothes shops, with fixed prices. Yet she could be working beyond midnight at the home and at the office.

There is no definition of alternative films. It totally depends on the film-makers why and how they will make films. But an alternative film maker must be committed to life and society, said eminent Indian film-maker Buddhadev Das Gupta while presenting his key-note paper on "Alternative Cinema: In Quest of a Concept."

"A real film maker must decide why he will make the film. He has to choose between money and reality. Independent film makers can not be influenced by the so-called mainstream film industry only for money, he observed.

"Lack of appreciation and monetary gain leads them to frustration. But the film makers depicting reality and life should not be disheartened. In the long run, their arts will get appreciation," said Cupta.


