Bangladesh is unlikely to seek smaller amount of foreign assistance in the Immediate luture, despite increased mobilisation of internal resources, said the outgoing External Resources Division (ERD) Secretary, Enam Ahmed Chaudhury, yesterday.

The country aims at achieving at least a five per cent growth rate in the years to come.

"I think the need for a large pipeline or for increased commitments would still be there as Bangladesh would like to have more than five per cent growth rate per year, so disbursement has to be higher in line with the increased level of economic activity," he

The longest serving ERD Secretary, Chaudhury is leaving for Jeddah tomorrow to join his new assignment as the Vice President of the Islamic
