Scheme taken for irri-boro cultivation in Satkhira

SATKIIIRA, Jan 26: A scheme has been undertaken to bring 34,000 hectares of land under irri-bore cultivation in the district during the current season, says UNB.

According to local Agriculture Extension Department, 17,500 hectares will be cultivated in Sadar, 8,500 hectares in Kolaroa, 6,800 hectares in Tala, 3600 hectares in Debhatta, 3600 hectares in Kaliganj, 2100 hectares in Assasuni and 1400 hectares in Shyannagar thanas.

With the successful implementation of the scheme it is expected that 1,16017 metric tons of paddy will be produced in the district.

The re-introduction of this Feeder Service is expected to boost exports like readymade garments, handicrafts, leather, jute, jute goods, etc.

Easy testing for iodised salt developed

The scientists of the nism. Institute of Food Science and Technology (IFST) have developed an easy process for preparation of "spot test solution" for qualitative determination of the presence of iodine in iodised salt, reports BSS.

"When a drop of this solution is applied to todised salt its colour will instantly change to violet. If the colour is not changed it will mean that the salt is not iodised," said the Bangladesh Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (BCSIR).

The research was conducted with the help of UNICEF which claimed to have tested the efficiency performance of the "spot test solution" through various mecha-

BCSIR said that the technology for the preparation of the spot test solution was handed over to the UNICEF for commercial exploitation,

Health hazards like gottre cretinism, mental retardation, physical deformity, deaf and dumb, squint eye etc might be created due to lack of iodine in the body. If iodised salt could be taken regularly like developed countries, one could easily get relief of these hazards, says BCSIR.

Research work is also being conducted by the BCSIR to develop "paper strip" method for quantitative estimation of iodine content in the iodised

Dhaka customs files cases against 80 plants, hotels

Dhaka Customs, Excise and VAT authorities have filed cases of worth Taka seven crore against 80 different factories and hotels in the city for non-payment of VAT during the month of December, aecording to a press release Tuesday, reports BSS.
