

Teachers' Assoc slates decision to nationalise schools, colleges

Bangladesh Teachers' Association in a press release slated the government decision to nationalise schools and colleges from every union of the country without any proper planning.

The press release jointly issued by the President of the association Sheikh Amanulla and General Secretary Azizul Haq Shah said that the initiative to nationalise only three to four hundred schools out of the total of 11 thousands would widen the existing gap between government and non-government teachers.

World University Service seminar at JU Code of conduct for student politics stressed

Chancellor of BUET Prof Mohammad Shajahan, Vice Chancellor of Rajshahi University Prof Anisur Rahman, Vice Chancellor of Khulna University Prof Golam Rahman, and others.

Prof Saleh was presenting his key-note paper of the seminar organised by the World University Service (WUS) entitled 'Student Politics in Bangladesh and Future of Higher Education.'

Blaming the political parties for practising politics for power Prof Saleh said that students bodies should be insulated from these political parties.

Speaker Sheikh Razzak Ali also underlined the need for political honesty, to curb violence in the educational arena. He called for a 'total democracy' comprising economical development and improvement of social condition.

Discussing on the key note paper Prof Abu Taher Ali of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) said that the political leaders gained at the expense of the students.

'Government spends Tk 80,000 for each University student every year,' he in-

formed. He also reminded of the huge loss of the government revenue due to the session jam in the universities caused by violence.

Guest speaker Prof Hamida Bano of Chittagong University called for banning student politics for the next five years to ensure academic atmosphere in the universities.

'Political parties that used the students in the anti-coercive movement cannot control the student force any longer,' she argued in favour of her statement.

Prof Rahman Siddiqi in his address said that violence has sparked off to the schools from the universities.

Prof Golam Rahman also traced violence in the primary level.

Terming Rajshahi University Campus the habitat of convicts, Vice Chancellor of the University Prof Anisur Rahman said that police cannot act freely there.

He held the unemployment crisis and the exploiting attitude of the political leaders responsible for the decline of the morals of the students.

The annual meeting of the WUS central committee was held after the seminar.

The meeting also reviewed the activities of BARD, Comilla and discussed the progress of the implementation of its different poverty alleviation and rural development projects of the current fiscal year.

The Deputy Minister Md Abdul Hye directed the concerned officials to implement the projects in stipulated time with honesty and sincerity.

2 lakh cows inseminated artificially

RAJSHAH, Jan 31: The Livestock Department has artificially inseminated about one lakh 95 thousand cows during the first six months of the current fiscal year in Rajshahi division achieving the yearly target by 50 per cent, reports BSS.

During the period the department has vaccinated 18 lakh 20 thousand cattleheads and two crore 95 thousand hens and ducks in the division achieving the yearly target by 22 and 38 per cent respectively.

Abut four lakh 85 thousand cattleheads and 13 lakh 30 thousand poulters have been provided treatment during the time.

The department also distributed about one lakh 68 thousand day-old poulters, one lakh improved species of hens, 39 thousand ducks and one lakh 5 thousand eggs of hens and ducks among the farmers during the time.

Abul Bashir Akand, Deputy Director of Translation and Compilation Department of Islamic Foundation Bangladesh, died here yesterday at the Diabetic Hospital. He was 38, reports BSS.

He had been suffering from diabetes for sometime. He left behind his parents, wife and a daughter.

Late Abul Bashir Akand was a very brilliant student and stood first class first in the Kamel examination. He authored 18 books including some translations.

The namaz-e-janaza of late Akand was held yesterday at the Baitul Mokarram National Mosque after Jhor prayer.

Noted industrialist and social worker Aziz HA Sattar died of cancer yesterday morning, he was 55, reports BSS.

He left behind three sons, two daughters and a host of relatives, well-wishers and friends to mourn his death.

International level shooting award winner Abdus Sattar Nini is the eldest son of the deceased.

Late Sattar was buried at Banani graveyard following namaz-e-janaza after Asr prayers at Gulshan central mosque yesterday.

The government has constituted a one member enquiry committee with Additional Divisional Commissioner of Dhaka A M Sirajul Islam to investigate into the December 26 incidents of last year in Keraniganj, according to an official press release Saturday reports BSS.

The concerned persons will be informed through letters to deliver their statements before the committee on specific dates.

Five with arms arrested in Ctg

CHITTAGONG, Jan 31: A special squad of Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) arrested five miscreants and rescued a kidnapped man and recovered two revolvers with fourteen ammunition from Chandanpara area here today, reports BSS.

CMP sources said that the miscreants riding in a microbus kidnapped one Zahidur Rahman from court building area and proceeded towards Chandanpara. Police intercepted the microbus and later searched its occupants. Two revolvers with ten and four rounds of ammunition respectively were found with Rezaur Rahman and Arif Akbar.

Rezaur Rahman allegedly tried to shoot at Police Inspector Serajul Islam at the time of his arrest, but Inspector Islam foiled his attempt.

Three other miscreants in the microbus were Javed Chowdhury, Shaful Azam and Milton Chowdhury.

Two separate cases were filed with Kotwali Police Station.
